
Deputy Parks LCSO, responded to 19670 Highway 11 East (Ace Hardware), in reference to a shoplifting. Dispatch advised the store manager noticed a female that had been in the store for over an hour and was acting strange. Prior to arrival, deputies made contact with the female, Ms. Trina Green. Ms. Green was in possession of a blue Yeti cup and the price tag had been removed. The manager of Ace advised they were missing a Yeti cup matching the de-

scription of the one Ms. Green possessed. While attempting to detain Ms. Green she began actively resisting and had to be controlled by deputies. Ms. Green was detained and while patting Ms. Green down for weapons, Deputy noticed the outline of what appeared to be a hypodermic needle in Ms. Green's pocket. Deputy asked Ms. Green what the outline was and if the object would poke me. Ms. Green advised she did not know what the object was and that it would not poke him, she then advised the Deputy to look in the pocket. The item was determined to be a hypodermic needle. Ms. Green was placed in Deputies patrol vehicle, which the deputy searched before she entered. The needle was photographed and disposed of in a sharps container. Deputy then transported Ms. Green to the

jail without incident. When removing Ms. Green from his backseat, a crystal-like substance which looked to be methamphetamine was located where she had been sitting. After removal of his backseat, a baggie and individual shards of meth were found (approximately 30 grams), as well as a baggie of marijuana (approxi-

mately 3 grams), all of which had been pushed through the seatbelt slit in his seat. The drug evidence was bagged and later identified by True Narc as methamphetamine. Both the marijuana and the methamphetamine have been placed into evidence. All of the above occurred in Loudon County, TN.
