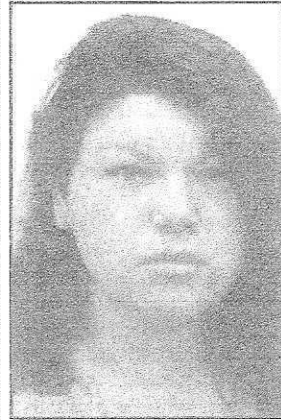

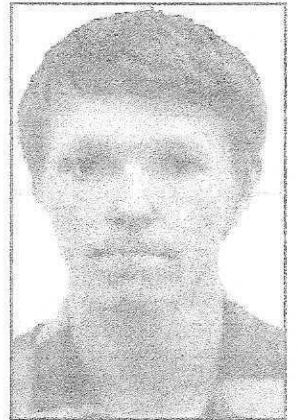

Air National Guardsman Indicted for Unlawful Disclosure of Classified National Defense Information

A member of the U.S. Air National Guard (USANG) stationed in Massachusetts was indicted today by a federal grand jury in Boston for allegedly retaining and transmitting classified national defense information on a social media platform beginning in or around 2022 and continuing until his arrest in April.

Jack Douglas Teixeira, 21, of North Dighton, Massachusetts, was indicted on six counts of willful retention and

transmission of classified information relating to the national defense (National Defense Information). Teixeira was arrested on April 13, 2023, and charged by criminal complaint with retention and transmission of national defense information and unauthorized removal and retention of classified documents or materials. On May 19, 2023, U.S. District Court Magistrate Judge David H. Hennessy granted the government's motion for detention.

Teixeira remains in federal custody.

"As laid out in the indictment, Jack Teixeira was entrusted by the United States government with access to classified national defense information — including information that reasonably could be expected to cause exceptionally grave damage to national security if shared," said Attorney General

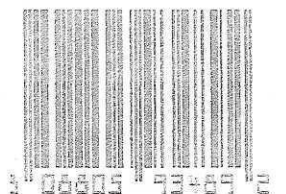

Joshua Kinser, 34, Hackberry Street Oak Ridge, was charged with Criminal Impersonation, Evading Arrest, Resisting Arrest, and Assisting other Agency.

Deputy Daniel Allen LCSO, had just cleared a possible assault at Highway 321 N. At the Love's truck stop, Deputies had arrived and found the subjects were possibly gone. The only description the complainant code was a male and a female. As the deputy and deputy Parks were clearing they noticed a white Mazada with a male and female pulling into the gas pumps. Deputy Kenny Palmer was at the I-40 EB on ramp and saw Mr.

Carmen Clements, 23, Knob Road Vonore, was charged with Simple Possession x5, and Poss. of Drug Para.

Timothy Whitehead, 27, Knob Road Vonore, was charged with Simple Possession x5, and Simple Possession.

Deputy Davis LCSO, conducted a traffic stop at Christian Street. The reason for stop was for a covered unreadable registration displayed on the vehicle. Upon approach, Deputy made contact with the driver Timothy Whitehead. While speaking with Timothy, the Deputy observed two pistols located in the driver-side door and between the driver-side seat and the center console of the vehicle. The deputy asked Timothy to exit the vehicle. While patting Timothy down

for weapons, Timothy advised he had a meth pipe in his front left pocket. Timothy later advised the passenger Carmen Clements had marijuana in her bra.

The deputy asked Carmen to exit the vehicle. Carmen handed the deputy the marijuana located in her bra and a digital scale out of her panties. Corporal Wallen arrived on scene and asked Carmen to consent to a person search. Carmen shortly after handed a black container to Corporal Wallen out of her bra. The black container contained a small baggy with a white crystalized substance, a blue small baggy with a gray gravelly substance, a small baggy with a green leafy substance, a white pipe, a single dollar bill, one Lortab pill, one Adderall pill, and one red cut straw. Timothy claimed

ownership of all drugs and drug paraphernalia. Due to Timothy claiming ownership, and Carmen possessing the drugs and drug paraphernalia, both subjects were taken into custody for simple possession and possession of drug paraphernalia. The white crystalized substance weighed 1.0 grams as packaged on an uncertified scale. The grey gravelly substance weighed .3 grams as packaged on an uncertified scale.

Deputy seized a Taurus G2C and Grendel Inc P-12 pistols and one pair of Smith and Wesson handcuffs for safe-keeping.

Deputy Jenkins tested the white crystalized substance with the TruNarc machine, and it tested positive for methamphetamines. Timothy and Carmen were transported to the Loudon County Detention Facility. This incident occurred in Loudon County Tennessee.

 Parker Guyton, 20, Gayland Drive Knoxville, was charged with Underage Driving while Intoxicated.

Officer T. LaForce LCPD, was on patrol traveling on Hwy 321 N. Officer did observe a dark colored vehicle traveling on Hwy 321 failing to maintain lane, speeds were repetitively increasing and decreasing, and continuously engaging the breaks. Officer initiated his emergency lights and conducted a traffic stop on

the above vehicle at the T-Mobile parking lot in Lenoir City. Upon making contact with the driver identified as Parker James Guyton. Officer asked Mr. Guyton for his registration and insurance, while he was trying to find his information Officer Law spotted a marijuana bowl in the passenger side glove box, along with 2 THC vape pins in the middle console. Mr. Guyton was asked if he would give consent to a vehicle search to which he agreed. Talking with Guyton

Officer smelled an alcoholic odor emitting from his persons, when asked if he had consumed alcohol, he stated he had drunk a vodka and sprite mixture unknown how many shots as he stated and told Sgt. Bialek that he had drank a corona extra as he was leaving work. Officer asked how long it had been since he had smoked marijuana due to him having glossy eyes and stating he was tired. Mr. Guyton explained he had smoked before he went to work around 2:30 and during work he smoked his THC pen throughout his shift. Guyton was asked if he would perform the standardized field sobriety


test, which he did give consent to perform the test. Sgt Bialek did conduct the test on Mr. Guyton, in which he performed poorly on all the tests asked to perform, also went through a series of ARIDE test. Mr. Guyton did perform poorly on all the tasks. Due to the totality of the circumstances Mr. Guyton was placed under arrest for underage driving while impaired. He did give consent for a blood draw and stated that if they test his blood, it will show high levels of THC. He was transported to the Fort Loudon Medical center, then to the Loudon County Jail.

Merrick B. Garland. "Teixeira is charged with sharing information with users on a social media platform he knew were not entitled to receive it. In doing so, he is alleged to have violated U.S. law and endangered our national security."

"Individuals granted security clearances are entrusted to protect classified information and safeguard our nation's secrets. The allegations in today's indictment reveal a serious violation of that trust," said FBI Director Christopher Wray. "The FBI and our partners remain firm in our commitment to hold accountable those who endanger our national security and the security of our allies around the world."

"The unauthorized removal, retention, and transmission of classified information jeopardizes our nation's security. Individuals granted access to classified materials have a fundamental duty to safeguard the information for the safety of the United States, our active service members, its citizens, and its allies," said Acting U.S. Attorney Joshua S. Levy for the District of Massachusetts. "We are committed to ensuring that those entrusted with sensitive national security information adhere to the law."

According to the charging documents, Teixeira enlisted in the USANG in September 2019 and has held a Top Secret security clearance since 2021. It is alleged that, beginning in or around January 2022, Teixeira willfully, improperly, and unlawfully retained and transmitted National Defense Information classified as "TOP SECRET" or "SECRET" and or Sensitive

Compartmented Information, which he had reason to believe could be used to the injury of the United States or to the advantage of a foreign nation, on a social media platform to persons not authorized to receive such information.

According to the charging documents, Teixeira transmitted the classified National Defense Information on the social media platform in two ways. First, Teixeira allegedly accessed classified documents containing National Defense Information from a classified workstation at the Otis USANG Base and transcribed and transmitted the information in written paragraphs to other users on the social media platform. Teixeira also posted images of classified documents to the social media platform, which bore standard classification markings – including "SECRET," "TOP SECRET," and SCI designations – indicating that they contained highly classified United States government information. At least one of the documents containing national defense information was allegedly found in digital form in a particular account associated with Teixeira.

Each charge of unauthorized retention and transmission of national defense information provides for a sentence of up to 10 years in prison, up to three years of supervised release, and a fine of up to \$250,000. A federal judge will determine any sentence after considering the U.S. Sentencing Guidelines and other statutory factors.

The FBI Boston and Washington Field Offices are investigating the case. The Naval Criminal Investigative Service and the Air

Force Office of Special Investigations provided valuable assistance.

Assistant U.S. Attorneys Nadine Pellegrini, Jared C. Dolan, and Jason A. Casey for the District of Massachusetts and Trial Attorney Christina A. Clark of the National Security Division's Counterintelligence and Export Control Section are prosecuting the case.

A criminal complaint is merely an allegation. All defendants are presumed innocent unless and until proven guilty beyond a reasonable doubt in a court of law.
