

A Florida woman pleaded guilty on Monday, June 26, 2023, to a felony charge related to the breach of the U.S. Capitol on Jan. 6, 2021. Her actions and the actions of others disrupted a joint session of the U.S. Congress convened to ascertain and count the electoral votes related to the presidential election.

Deputy Parks LCSO, observed a vehicle with a license plate bent upward causing it to be unreadable. Deputy initiated a traffic stop on the vehicle on Elm Street at Christian Street. Deputy made contact with the driver, and advised him of the reason for stop and gathered documents. While gathering documents Deputy asked the passengers for their name and dates of birth, and they identified themselves as Ms. Anneka Carver and Mr. Rob-

While searching Mr. Merrill Deputy found a flashlight containing a baggie with a white crystalized substance (approximate field weight 1.81 grams). Mr. Merrill was detained and a female was called to search Ms. Carver. A search of the vehicle also yielded a meth pipe where Mr. Merrill had been sitting. Officer Ingram arrived on scene and a search of the female yielded a meth pipe in her groin area. Ms. Carver was placed under arrest, ert Merrill. I advised dispatch at which point she advised to run a warrant check on the officers she had meth in her

groin. Ms. Carver retrieved a baggie containing methamphetamine (approximate field weight 1.15 grams). Both the meth and paraphernalia were bagged and both subjects were transported to the Loudon County Justice Center without incident.

Both baggies were later identified as methamphetamine by TruNarc. Both the paraphernalia and drug evidence was bagged and placed into evidence. All of the above occurred in Loudon County, Tennessee.

Carolyn Thaxton, 61, was charged with Domestic Assault, and Resisting Arrest.



Officer R. Miller, with the Lenoir City Police Department, responded to the area of West 2nd Avenue located in Lenoir City, TN in regards to a call referencing a possible stolen vehicle. While in route to the area the complainant/victim, had called back into central dispatch stating that he located his vehicle and the female subject who drove it down the road. The complainant stated that the female who took his vehicle had been using narcotics. During the investigation, Officer made contact with REAGAN who was in the passenger's seat of the vehicle. REAGAN appeared to have pinpoint pupils and could not follow simple instructions without being told several times. REAGAN also

could not control her body movements and could not stand still. Victim did give verbal consent to conduct a search of the entire vehicle. Located in the passenger's side floorboard where REAGAN was sitting was a glass pipe with a charred bottom commonly used to smoke methamphetamine along with a MTN Dewbottle that contained several hypodermic needles. REAGAN posed a danger to herself

REAGAN stated that the needles did belong to her and mentioned to officers on scene that she had used methamphetamine earlier that morning. Prior to placing REAGAN into handcuffs, she retrieved a bag containing a crystal-like substance believed to be methamphetamine from her bar and handed it to him. The approximate weight of the

bag including the crystal-like substance was (0.41 grams). While in custody at the Loudon County Jail, two additional bags in the bra of REAGAN containing a crystal-like substance believed to be methamphetamine. The two bags along with the crystal-like substance inside of them weighed out to be approximately (0.90 grams).

they're trying to steal it from us. Let's go!"

While inside a hall of the Capitol building, Montoni was in the midst of a crowd surrounded by other rioters. Montoni and others then began to push against officers attempting to stop them from proceeding. In another video recording, Montoni can be seen yelling, "Push back! Push back!" in support of the crowd of rioters.

Court documents say that Montoni remained in the Capitol building for approximately 10 minutes before exiting. Montoni then re-entered the building at least one time, despite being aware that police were attempting to remove people from the building.

According to court documents, Montoni posted on social media throughout the day on January 6th about her experiences at the Capitol. On her Parler account, she stated in part, "WE BREACHED THE CAPITOL OMG"; "Insurrection is coming. Hold the line. Stay vigilant."; "Storming the Capitol to take back our country from traitors! This is OUR HOUSEEEE!"; and "Here's a pretty little view form inside the Capitol at our traitor DC police, with a smashed window." On her Facebook account, she stated in part, "We are DONE with these traitors. Today, we showed them how done

we are. The Capitol building belongs to Us, we the people. This is our house... We broke a few windows, sure but we are a peaceful protect occupying the people's property."

The charge of Civil Disorder carries a statutory maximum sentence of five years in prison. A federal court judge will determine the appropriate sentence after considering all factors and the U.S. Sentencing guidelines. All charges carry potential financial penalties.

The case is being prosecuted by the U.S. Attorney's Office for the District of Columbia and the Department of Justice National Security Division's Counterterrorism Section. Valuable assistance was provided by the U.S. Attorney's Office for the Middle District of Florida.

The case is being investigated by the FBI's Tampa and Washington Field Offices, as well as the Metropolitan Police Department, with significant assistance provided by the U.S. Capitol Police.

In the 29 months since Jan. 6, 2021, more than 1,000 individuals have been charged in nearly all 50 states for crimes related to the breach of the U.S. Capitol, including nearly 350 individuals charged with assaulting or impeding law enforcement. The investigation remains ongoing.






