### Parole

A former youth group leader at Bethany Baptist Church is serving 12 years in jail after accepting a plea deal. Courtney Bingham, 36, pleaded guilty to four counts of statutory rape and sexual exploitation of a minor. In 2018, Bingham had a sexual relationship with a 16-year-old member of the youth group.

"We are glad to get this resolved with the defendant admitting her wrong-doing," 9th Judicial Dis-trict Attorney General Russell Johnson said.

Bingham was sentenced other charges running consecutively. She has to serve at least 35% of the sentence

before being eligible for parole. She will be on the sex offender registry for life and is subject to monitoring, including monitoring of her internet activities.

Captain Jeff Russell also lost his job as a result of his inappropriate contact with Bingham while she was in custody and former Sheriff Tim Guider allowed Russell to retire instead of termination.



Officer Parmer LCPD, was dispatched to McDonald's, 402 Hwy 321 N, in regards to a male slumped over at the wheel of a white Ford F150, in the drive thru. Upon arrival, Officer observed the vehicle, a white Ford F150, bearing TN tag 699BFNP, stopped in the drive through line.

Upon my approach of the vehicle, which was running and in park, the officer observed a male, later identified as 32-year-old Nicholas Loyd, in the driver seat, slumped over.

Jhonny Mejia, 31, Shaw Ferry Road Lenoir City, was charged with DUI, and Violation of Implied Consent.

Officer Law LCPD, was on routine patrol when he observed a black Ford Explorer (TN Tag 237-BHKY) with its back right taillight hanging off the vehicle causing it to have only one working taillight. Whitaker acknowledged to investigators that she had taken school collections and used the cash due to personal financial problems.

Investigators were not able to confirm the legitimacy of the information on the receipts.

Karen Whitaker's employment was terminated on September 1, 2022. Based upon this investigation, in May 2023, the Hamblen County Grand Jury indicted her on one count of theft over \$1,000, one count of identity theft, and one count of forgery over \$1,000.

"School leaders must ensure they are separating the financial responsibilities within their buildings," said Comptroller Mumpower. "Whittaker was responsible for receipting collections. preparing bank deposits, and reconciling receipts with bank deposits. Separating those duties and increasing oversight helps prevent fraudulent activity.






