## CDC to Launch "Bridge Access Program" in Fall 2023 to Provide Free COVID-19 Vaccines to Uninsured and Underinsured Adults

To help ensure that millions of uninsured and underinsured American adults continue to have access to no-cost COVID-19 vaccinations, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) is launching the Bridge Access Program for COVID-19 Vaccines this fall.

There are an estimated 25-30 million adults without insurance in the U.S., and there are additional adults whose insurance will not provide free coverage for COVID-19 vaccines

after these products transition to the commercial market for procurement, distribution, and pricing, later this fall. The pandemic highlighted longstanding barriers to adult vaccination, including lack of accessibility, lack of availability, and lack of confidence. Under the management and oversight of CDC, the Bridge Access Program – for a limited time – will allow adults who are uninsured or underinsured to receive free COVID-19 vaccinations.

from COVID-19 remains a top priority for CDC," CDC Director Dr. Mandy Cohen said. "CDC is partnering with state and local public health agencies, health centers, and pharmacies to ensure that all adults nationwide maintain access to lifesaving COVID-19 vaccines. Ultimately, we know that vaccines save money and lives. Vaccination is especially important as

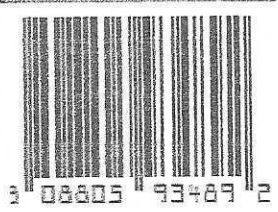

Amber Jerrell, 31, Fowler Lane Clinton, was charged with Mfg/Del/Sale or Poss. of Meth, and Poss. of Drug Para.

Officer R. Miller, with the Lenoir City Police Department, responded to Highway 321 (EZ Stop Gas Station) located in Lenoir City, TN in regards to a welfare check. The caller who was an employee for the EZ Stop gas station stated that there was a female who had been sitting in a maroon in color Ford Fusion at the gas pumps for approximately an hour and had the hood of her vehicle propped up. On scene Officer made contact with the female who was inside of the maroon Ford Fusion, Amber Jerrell of Clinton, TN. While speaking with JERRELL the officer noticed

that her pupils were pinpoint (sun was not out - cloudy day), along with the whites of her eyes being bloodshot. JERRELL also seemed lethargic and could comprehend simple tasks. During the investigation JERRELL stated that she had smoked marijuana at some point during the night or early morning hours of 07/14/2023 into 07/15/2023. Officer observed a small silver pill container attached to AMBER'S keys and asked if she would open it at which time she did and turned it upside down into Officer R. Deland's hands. When AMBER did so there was a small amount of powder like residue coming out. At this time AMBER verbally consented to a search of her entire vehicle.

Located during a subsequent search of the vehicle was a

large bag containing several small new, unused clear plastic bags (center console) which are commonly used for the resale of narcotics and are referenced to as "dime bags" and a yellow cut straw containing white residue inside of it (back seat). At this time, Officer placed JERRELL under arrest. While under arrest officer asked JERRELL if she

had anything on her person at which time, she became upset and stated that she had something in her bra. JERRELL retrieved two bags of a crystal-like substance. After a randomized interview, JERRELL stated that the crystal-like substance was methamphetamine. The two bags containing the crystal-like substance weighed approx. (36 grams).

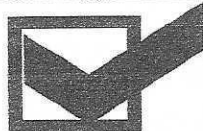

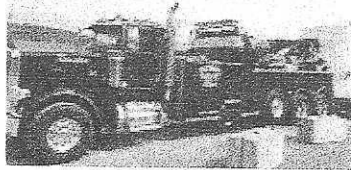
Jill Marsh, 54, Hayward Road Pocomoke City, was charged with Criminal Trespass.

we head into fall and winter, a time when COVID-19 and other respiratory diseases are likely to circulate.”

A dedicated team within CDC's Immunization Services Division has been established to help launch the new program this fall. CDC will purchase COVID-19 vaccines and allocate them, along with the funding needed to implement this new program, through CDC's established network of state and local immunization programs. These partners will then facilitate distribution of these vaccines to participating community-based providers, including local health departments and Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA)-supported health centers. In order to broaden access, CDC is also working closely with select national pharmacy chains, as well as vaccine manufacturers, to enable uninsured adults to receive free COVID-19 vaccines at participating retail pharmacy locations.

CDC has published its intent to modify existing Increasing Community Access to Testing (ICATT) program contracts with those select pharmacy partners with proven capacity to reach and vaccinate millions of adults. It is expected that through such agreements with participating pharmacy chains that the Bridge Access Program will reimburse pharmacies for the administration fees, enabling pharmacies

to administer vaccine doses for the Program. CDC has also been working closely with manufacturers, as their voluntary collaboration is critical to ensure that there is an adequate supply of vaccines for this program.

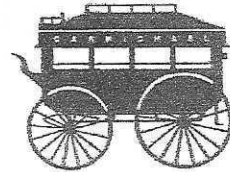
It's important to note that the Bridge Access Program serves as a "temporary bridge" and is scheduled to end in December 2024. A longer-term solution is the Vaccines for Adults (VEA) program, proposed in both the FY 2023 and 2024 Presidential Budgets, which would create a permanent initiative modeled after the successful Vaccines for Children (VFC) program, and would cover all recommended vaccinations at no cost for uninsured adults. This proposal has not yet been enacted into law.

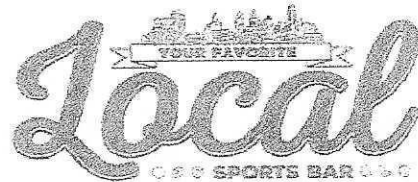

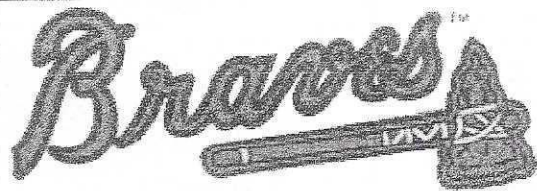



Officer R. Miller, with the Lenoir City Police Department, was conducting a patrol in the area Broadway near the intersection of B Street in Lenoir City, TN. During patrol duties the officer observed a red in color Ford pickup truck disregard the red light at the intersection of Broadway and B Street. Officer then initiated a traffic stop on the vehicle in the area of Broadway and C Street. Upon the traffic stop the officer made contact with the driver Daniel Raby, who stated that he was not paying attention at the time he disregarded the red light. 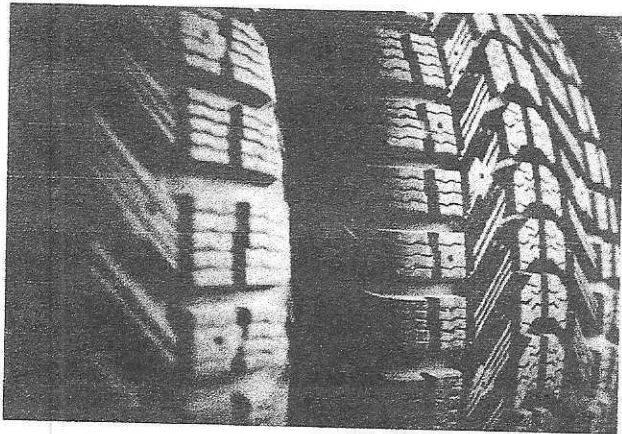

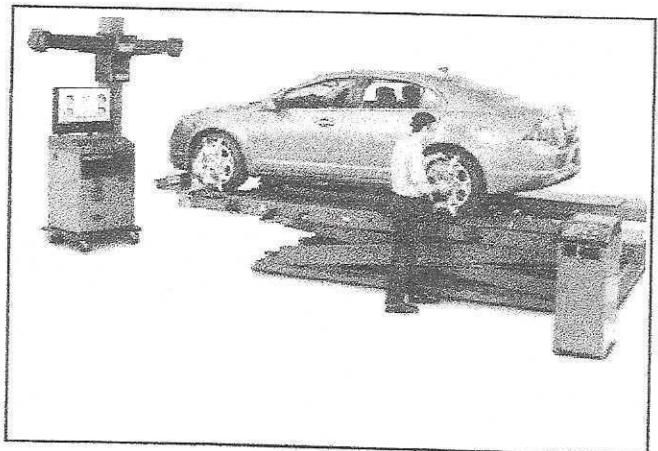
