

we head into fall and winter, a time when COVID-19 and other respiratory diseases are likely to circulate.

A dedicated team within CDC's Immunization Services Division has been established to help launch the new program this fall. CDC will purchase COVID-19 vaccines and allocate them, along with the funding needed to implement this new program, through CDC's established network of state and local immunization programs. These partners will then facilitate distribution of these vaccines to participating community-based providers, including local health departments and Health Resources and Services (HRSA)-sup-Administration ported health centers. In order Access Program launch are to broaden access, CDC is also working closely with select national pharmacy chains, as well as vaccine manufacturers, to enable uninsured adults to receive free COVID-19 vaccines at participating retail pharmacy

CDC has published its intent to modify existing Increasing Community Access to Testing (ICATT) program contracts with those select pharmacy partners with proven capacity to reach and vaccinate millions of adults. It is expected that through such agreements with participating pharmacy chains that the Bridge Access Program will reimburse pharmacies for the administration fees, enabling pharmacies


to administer vaccine doses for the Program. CDC has also been working closely with manufacturers, as their voluntary collaboration is critical to ensure that there is an adequate supply of vaccines for this program.


It's important to note that the Bridge Access Program serves as a "temporary bridge" and is scheduled to end in December 2024. A longer-term solution is the Vaccines for Adults (VFA) program, proposed in both the FY 2023 and 2024 Presidential Budgets, which would create a permanent initiative modeled after the successful Vaccines for Children (VFC) program, and would cover all recommended vaccinations at no cost for uninsured adults. This proposal has not yet been enacted into law.





Officer R. Miller, with the Lenoir City Police Department, was conducting a patrol in the area Broadway near the intersection of B Street in Lenoir City, TN. During patrol duties the officer observed a red in color Ford pickup truck disregard the red light at the intersection of Broadway and B Street. Officer then initiated a traffic stop on the vehicle in the area of Broadway and C Street. 


