#### CDC Recommends RSV Vaccine For Older Adults

CDC Director Rochelle P. Walensky, M.D., M.P.H., endorsed the CDC Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices' (ACIP) recommendations for use of new Respiratory Syncytial Virus (RSV) vaccines from GSK and Pfizer for people ages 60 years and older, using shared clinical decision-making. means these individuals may receive a sin-

gle dose of the vaccine based on discussions with their healthcare provider about whether RSV vaccination is right for them.

Adults at the highest risk for severe RSV illness include older adults, adults with chronic heart or lung disease, adults with weakened immune systems, and adults living in nursing homes or long-term care facilities. CDC estimates



Deputy Charlie Huskins LCSO, did observe a gold Honda sedan sitting in the middle of ADESA Parkway at the intersection of Old Highway 95 running with the driver of the vehicle passed out behind the wheel. 

Gregory Hudson. 51, Crisp Road Lenoir City, was charged with DUI, Violation of Implied Consent, Driving on Revoked/Suspended License, and Open Container.

Officer Wilks LCPD, was dispatched to Petros, 762 Hwy 321 N, in reference to a drunk driver. Upon arrival, Officer made contact with the vehicle in question, a blue Nissan Rogue bearing TN tag, 122BFFS. Officer identified the driver of the vehicle to be Gregory Hudson and the passenger.

While speaking with Hudson, the Officer detected the odor of an alcoholic beverage coming from the vehicle. Officer observed that HUD-SON had slow and slurred speech along with bloodshot and glossy eyes. Hudson was asked for his drivers license, to which he presented

his debit card. After running Hudson's drivers license, he came back with a revoked license status. Hudson exited the vehicle and began stumbling around, and using his vehicle for balance several times. Hudson was asked to perform SFST's, to which he consented.

During HGN, Officer observed lack of smooth pursuit, distinct and sustained nystagmus at maximum deviation, and onset of nystagmus prior to 45 degrees in both eyes. During the instruction phase of walk and turn, Hudson had trouble maintaining his balance and started too. During the walking stage, Hudson stopped while walking, missed all heel-to-toe steps, stepped off of the line, made an improper turn, and performed the incorrect number of steps. During the one leg stand, Hudson put his foot down, used his arms for balance, and stopped performing the test in the middle of it. Hudson did admit to drinking three 120Z Miller Lite cans prior in the day. HUDSON was ultimately placed into my custody and read the TN Implied Consent form, to which he refused. During a

vehicle inventory search several open 120Z Miller Lite cans were found, which still had liquid inside of them. The vehicle was towed per Malones, and the passenger remained on scene at Petros and waited for a ride. HUD-SON was transported to the Loudon County Jail without further incident.






