

"Our victim specialists, service coordinators, child and adolescent forensic interviewers, and other victim service professionals work collaboratively with special agents to ensure a trauma-informed victim-centered approach is taken when engaging with victims," said Regina Thompson, assistant director of the Victim Services Division. "This is especially important when engaging with victims of human trafficking

as it is a very complex, traumatic crime."

Operation Cross Country grew out of a 2003 FBI initiative to identify and recover minors who have been sexually exploited. While the national sweeps draw attention to the issue of trafficking, the FBI and its partners work to investigate and stop trafficking every day.






