Grand Jury Meets and Returns Indictments

The Loudon County Grand Jury met on Monday to consider indictments in 32 cases presented by District Attorney General Russell Johnson. All but one of the cases presented resulted in indictments. The cases indicted included a first-degree murder involving a stabbing death of Daniel Mejia Cisneros at a residence

on Old Highway 11 in the Philadelphia area from September 29, 2022, where Erick Giovanni Santano-Lopez stabbed to death his roommate. Loudon County investigators arrested Lopez on the murder charge and the arrest warrant from last year indicates that an argument between the defendant and victim developed into a physical alter-

cation and that Santano-Lopez picked up a knife that fell from the television stand and started stabbing and cutting Cisneros. According to the statement Santano-Lopez gave the investigators, the warrant states that Santano-Lopez followed Cisneros into the kitchen where Cisneros sat in a chair. Santano-Lopez admit-

DUI Cases Also Part of Grand Jury

The report from the grand jury also contained three DUI cases. Driving Under the Influence (of alcohol and/or drugs) is a special focus in District Attorney General Russell Johnson's office as DUIs are responsible for so many innocent people being killed on the roadways, innocent victims who are not drinking and driving like their 'killers'. According to Johnson, Assistant District At-

torney Joe Caldwell has earned numerous regional and statewide awards for his prosecution of these cases. Joe Caldwell's goal in each case is to achieve justice by holding the impaired driver accountable for his or her decisions. Both Johnson and Caldwell acknowledge that requiring offenders to get evaluated by professionals as to their alcohol and other substance

Erwin Man Sentenced To 262 Months Imprisonment For Methamphetamine Trafficking

Joshua Dwayne Mabery, 47, of Erwin, Tennessee, was sentenced to 262 months in federal prison, by the Honorable J. Ronnie Greer, in the United States District Court for the Eastern District of Tennessee at Greeneville.

Following a three-day trial, ending on March 30, 2023, Mabery was convicted of conspiracy to distribute 50 grams or more of methamphetamine, in violation of

21 U.S.C. §§ 846 and 841(a)(1); and possession with the intent to distribute methamphetamine, in violation of 21 U.S.C. § 841(a)(1). Upon his release from prison, Mabery will be on supervised release for 10 years.

The evidence presented at trial demonstrated that Mabery, who had recently been released from prison related to a federal conviction in 2012 for conspiracy to manufacture methamphetamine, be-

gan distributing methamphetamine in the fall of 2020 in north-east Tennessee. In February 2021, he and a co-conspirator were arrested in Washington County, Tennessee, as they returned from Knoxville with over a half-kilogram of crystal methamphetamine they had just purchased from another co-conspirator.

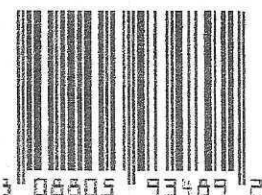

ted that he stabbed Cisneros again while he sat in the chair. The defendant than called 911 and, according to the warrant, admitted killing Cisneros. Santano-Lopez, who is evidently not in the United States legally, remains in custody at the Loudon County Jail since he has not made his \$60,000 bond, according to Jail Administrator Dusty Langley, and he will be arraigned on the indicted charges at the small Alma Place 'courtroom' on Monday, August 21st along with all other defendants indicted by the grand jury. District Attorney General Johnson indicated that ADAs Bob Edwards and Jed Bassett will be handling the prosecution of Mr. Santano-Lopez.

Luis Romero-Arevola, 29, Huerer Street Sweetwater, was charged with DUI, and Violation of Implied Consent.

Sgt. Pesterfield LCSO, witnessed a 2005 Ford F-150 traveling on Sugarlimb Rd. near Hotchkiss Valley Rd. W. Sgt. witnessed the vehicle traveling 38 mph in a 50 mph zone. Sgt. witnessed the vehicle cross the double yellow line three times and the fog line once. Sgt. initiated his emergency equipment to which the driver pulled into the entrance of Kimberly Clark. The district attorneys use these evaluations to determine whether defendants need either in-patient or out-patient rehab and they try to make these programs a component of what is required of defendant. ADA Caldwell is also convinced that the victim impact panels play an important

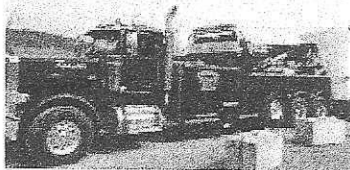
role in educating drivers who have come into the criminal justice system of the consequence of their drinking and driving. Caldwell teams with his DUI Unit Coordinator Holly Miller to work every DUI case that comes through the four-county judicial system in general sessions court and criminal court, including the Lenoir City municipal

court. While most DUI cases, since they are misdemeanors, get resolved in general sessions court, some are not resolved such as the three that were indicted by the grand

jury. ADA Caldwell has been highly successful in obtaining jury trial convictions on these cases that come to criminal court.

cis M. Hamilton III of the Eastern District of Tennessee made the announcement.

The criminal indictment was the result of a joint investigation by the Carter County Sheriff's Office, Johnson City Police Department, Tennessee Highway Patrol, Drug Enforcement Administration, Homeland Security Investigations, and United States Postal Service Office of Inspector General.

Assistant United States Attorneys J. Gregory Bowman and B. Todd Martin represented the United States.

This case was a result of the Department of Justice's Organized Crime and Drug Enforcement Task Forces (OCDETF) Strike Force Initiative, which provides for the establishment of permanent multi-agency task

force teams that work side-by-side in the same location. This co-located model enables agents from different agencies to collaborate on intelligence-driven, multi-jurisdictional operations to disrupt and dismantle the most significant drug traffickers, money launderers, gangs, and transnational criminal organizations.
