

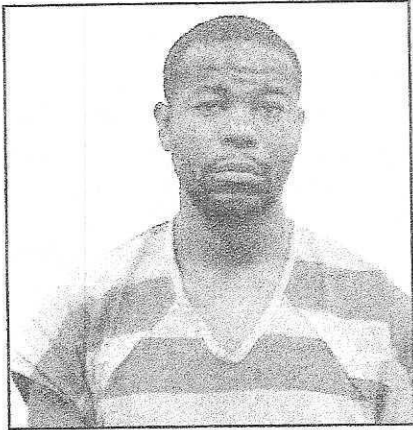

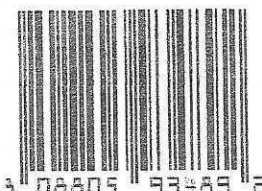

William Mcodory, 33, Calvert Street Detroit, was charged with Man/Sell/Del/Resale Sch. VI, and illegal Possession/Fraudulent use of Credit Card.

Delshun Neal, 21, High Hill Drive Vicksburg, was charged with Man/Sell/Del/Resale Sch. VI, Evading Arrest x2, and Reckless Endangerment.

Law enforcement spoke with William Mcodory by phone and he agreed to deliver Fentanyl pills and Marijuana to an address in Lenoir City. While en route to the address in Lenoir City Mcodory stated that

he and his friend were 20 minutes out from Lenoir City and that he had Fentanyl pills and Marijuana. When Mcodory arrived at the address he stated to law enforcement that he was at the address and knocked on the door occupied by law enforcement. Law Enforcement opened the door and made contact with Mcodory. When the driver of the vehicle Del'shun Neal saw law enforcement he fled in his vehicle at a high rate of speed losing traction multiple times. Fentanyl

Tiana Bennett, 23, Industrial Park Drive Lenoir City, was charged with Man/Sell/Del/Resale Sch. II, and Simple Possession.

Law enforcement contacted a person via text message attempting to purchase 40 fentanyl pills. The person agreed to sell 40 Fentanyl pills for 400.00 dollars and have a female deliver them to an address in Loudon City. The person messaged law enforcement that a female was delivering the pills and that she would be driving a silver Hyundai Sonata. A silver Hyundai Sonata was observed pulling into the meet location and the person messaged that the female was in the parking lot. Law enforcement made contact with the female in the parking lot who was identified as Tiana Bennett. As Agent DeBoer made contact with Bennett she immediately

stated the pills were in her bra and then retrieved the 40 fentanyl pills. Bennett was mirandized and agreed to speak to law enforcement. Bennett stated that she was delivering the fentanyl pills to someone that she knew in Knoxville. Law enforcement asked for consent to search her vehicle and she agreed. Upon searching Bennett's vehicle 11 grams of marijuana was found in her purse. Bennett was transported to the Loudon County Jail.

Robert Merrill, 36, County Road Sweetwater, was charged with Criminal Trespass.

Deputy Parks LCSO, responded to Get Good Hollow Road in reference to a trespasser. Deputy had responded to the residence earlier in the shift and spoke with the complainant, who advised an Merrill subject

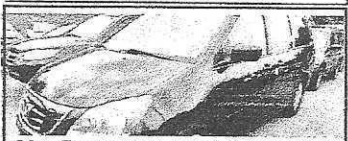

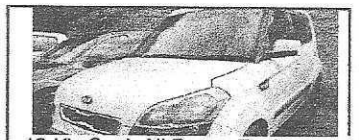

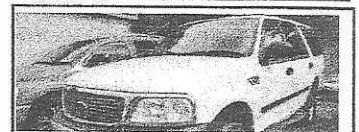

The past two summers, Cliff's Crew has traveled to a different city to learn about the communities and unique histories of each place, as well as the role African-Americans have played in cities across the nation.

This summer, during the group's visit to Washington, D.C., they participated in The FBI Experience, which

included a guided tour of the FBI Headquarters with interactive exhibits. Afterwards, ADD Turner joined the youth to discuss the FBI's mission and the importance of teamwork at the Bureau. He also answered questions from the Crew and shared words of wisdom and encouragement.

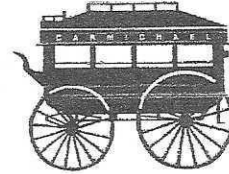
Turner continued by explaining that at the end of the day, the recipe for success is focusing on what you can control and take ownership of—regardless of external pressures.

"When I experienced past failures, I asked myself: What did I do?" he said. "Don't worry about what the teacher did. Don't worry about what coach doesn't like about you. What did I do that caused that failure, and what can I do moving forward to make it better? I can own that. That's what I pass on to you."

Turner concluded that new experiences are also key to personal growth.

"In my journey," he said, "I've always kind of gone outside my comfort zone. You need to get comfortable being uncomfortable because that's the only way you're going to grow. If you guys remember that, you will be leaders on a level that you hadn't even imagined. Be that leader. Stay true to yourself."
