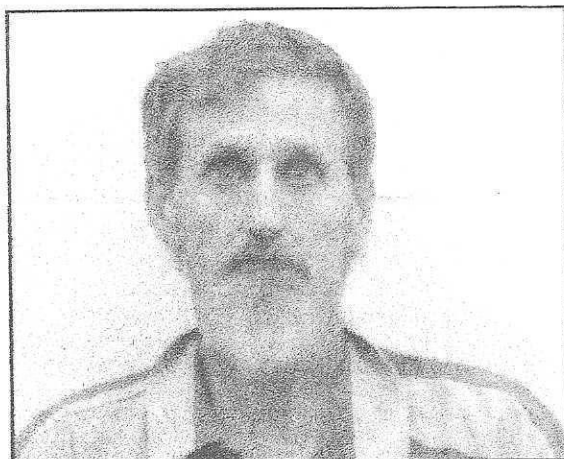

Polk County Circuit Court Clerk Employees Paid for Time Not Worked

An investigation by Tennessee Comptroller's Office has found that employees within the Polk County Circuit Court Clerk's office received wages and county-paid benefits totaling at least \$123,065.66 for time not worked.

The clerk allowed multiple employees to submit timesheets claiming 40 hours per week; however, the clerk regularly gave

employees one day off each week. Furthermore, the clerk closed the office for one hour during lunch each weekday prior to January 2022. At the direction of the clerk, the employees only regularly worked 28 hours per week (calculated below).

40 hours (reported hours) - 8 hours (one day off) - 4 hours (lunch off clock) = 28 hours

The county's personnel policy states that a full-time employee must work at least 32 hours per week. Full-time employment is required to receive annual leave, sick leave, compensatory time, and an option for insurance coverage by the county.

Jimmy Burnette, 27, Grove Street Loudon, was charged with Aggravated Assault, Public Intoxication, Resisting Arrest, and Evading Arrest.

Officer Silvey LPD, was dispatched to verbal domestic call dealing with a mother and father over their three children at Loudon View Apartments, apartment .

The Report stated, Upon arrival fellow officers and officer Silvey, spoke with a Mr. Jimmy Burnette. Speaking with Mr. Burnette we tried to deescalate the situation, and he kept cussing and making threats to fight officers and if he had his gun he would have shot them upon arrival on scene. Mr.

Burnette was belligerent and non-cooperative. He also had the smell of alcohol coming off his person.

After several minutes of the threats from Mr. Burnette, and officers trying to deescalate the situation, officers took the initiative to detain him for their safety by using OC spray. Then Mr. Burnette took off running on foot, and we proceeded to take the next step and tased him to detain him.

Once he was tased, he still resisted, moments later officers successfully took Mr. Burnette into custody. From there we spoke with the kids mom/victim. The victim stated that he brandished a weapon and stated "im going to kill you" because she was leaving with their children.

The victim also stated "she was only there to get the kids some clothes". The altercation between Mr. Burnette and victim took place at Lake View Apartments Grove St. Loudon T.N. 37774.

Officers recovered the weapon brandish to the victim which she later identify a the weapon that was brandish to her. Officers arrested Mr. Burnette for aggravated assault.

According to the report, Officer Valletto LPD, was Dispatched to the Inn of Loudon for a domestic that had taken place minutes prior to his arrival. Upon arrival Officer spoke to the victim, who stated to the officer that himself and Ms. Anglin had been in a verbal altercation and he had asked Ms. Anglin to leave because she was not welcome in his room anymore. Ms. Anglin began packing up her room and upon completion of gathering her belongings the victim stated that she sat in her car for an hour waiting on her cat to come to her.

The report further stated, Ms. Anglin later started her car and drove to the shell gas station across the street from

the Inn of Loudon waiting on a friend to come pick her up. Burglary

James Hammontree, 46, County Road 26 Calhoun, was charged with Burglary, and Public Intoxication.

Sgt. Pesterfield LCSO, responded to a burglary alarm that indicated front door motion at the Dollar General located at Mialaquo Rd. Loudon.

Upon arrival Deputy was met by the manager of the store, who stated someone had attempted to open the doors, but they were locked. There was an unattended white Chevrolet S10 in the parking lot that the manager stated should not be there. Deputy noticed a free space between the two automatic sliding doors. Deputies cleared the store, and nobody was found. Upon reviewing the security camera footage, at approximately 0255 hrs. a male wearing a white shirt and work pants is seen attempting to open the sliding

doors multiple times. Prior to the male attempting this there were no other vehicles in the parking lot, the doors did not open upon approach, and the store was dark. After Deputy left the store at approximately 0327 hrs. he witnessed the same male looking inside the door at the Sloan's Hardware store located beside the Dollar General. Deputy detained the Male identified as Mr. James Hammontree, the offender, who was the owner of the S10 truck left at the Dollar General. While speaking with the offender deputy noticed him to have dilated pupils, slowed sluggish movements, and thick speech. The offender looked at the side of his patrol vehicle and asked how he ended up in Loudon County. The offender admitted he took unprescribed clonazepam earlier in the night. Due to the offenders intoxication level it was apparent he was a danger to himself and

property if left in public. After advising the offender of the Miranda warnings, deputy asked him what he was doing to which he stated he was looking for his wife. After asking him about the video showing him attempting to gain entry to the closed store, he stated he thought the store was open and he wanted to get a drink. On the door deputy witnessed the offender looking into at the Sloan's Hardware Store, there were multiple what looked to be fresh pry marks made from a

small blade next to the lock. Located on the offender's person was a small knife with fresh scratches on the blade. Security cameras at Sloan's does not show this door but showed the offender lingering around the back of the property attempting to open a locked gate. Due to the circumstances above deputy is charging the offender with two counts of attempted burglary and public intoxication. All the above actions did occur in Loudon County, TN.

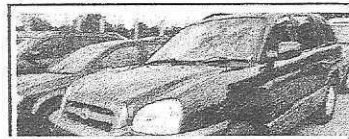

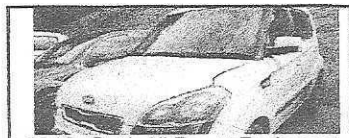

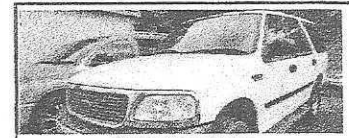

- Unsupported Comp Time \$1,943.51
- Annual Leave Taken \$358.75
- Sick Leave Taken \$347.05
- Insurance Provided \$93,391.91
- Total \$123,065.66

Seven circuit court clerk employees also improperly received a total of 108.92 of service credits with the Tennessee Consolidated Retirement System. Because the employees were regularly working only 28 hours per week, they were not entitled to receive full-time service credits with TCRS.

“The Polk County Circuit Court Clerk should also discontinue the use of signature stamps in the office,” said Comptroller Jason Mumpower. “A signature stamp of a Polk County judge was improperly used by the clerk’s office on two expungement orders. Internal controls over the use of signature stamps are inherently weak, and state law does not provide authority for their use.

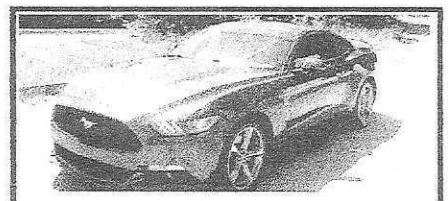

Old Slag Rd where suspect was detained. Suspect stated freely to Officer McMahan that he had been asked to help his friend Brian Brewster move two lawn mowers. The theft had occurred after 2000 and without contact with the owner, who had been at work at the time. The suspect was also a convicted felon and had a small pistol located in the truck. Officer McMahan agreed to write warrants for the Felon in possession of the firearm. Suspect was placed under arrest and transported to the Loudon County Jail by T Branson 974. The lawn mowers were recovered from the traffic stop by the victim. Deputy then went to the McDonald's located at

the intersection of Hwy 411 S and Hwy 72 W, where Deputy spoke to the complainant and witness. The witness provided a written statement and stated that the driver of the sedan had exited his vehicle while she followed them, attempting to get her to lose sight of the truck that had the lawn mowers. Witness was able to identify Brian Brewster as the second involved male with the help of Driver's License photos. The suspect and Brian Brewster both entered a building without authorization from the owner with the intent to commit theft, stealing two green John Deere zero turn lawn mowers valued at \$3,500 each. Warrants were issued for Brewster. This did occur in Loudon County, TN.
