



Officer R. Miller, with the Lenoir City Police Department, was in the parking lot of Highway 321 (Exxon Gas Station) in Lenoir City, TN. 
check due to the circumstances presented and due to the fact that we have had several nonfatal overdose cases in gas station parking lots.






