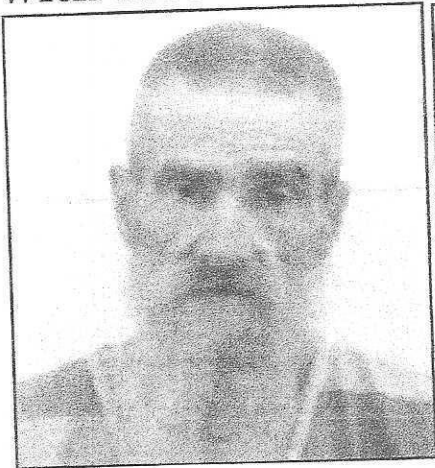

## Sevier County Central Dispatch Director Investigated

An investigation by the Tennessee Comptroller's Office has examined the operations of the Sevier County Central Dispatch E911 (SCCD) department of Sevier County government. The SCCD provides county-wide 911 emergency telephone services

Investigators determined that the SCCD director made questionable pur-

chases totaling at least \$9,462.80 from July 2021 through March 2023.

These purchases included tactical equipment, clothing, food and drinks, travel, and supplies. Investigators question the business-related purpose of these expenditures and whether the items were used exclusively in the operation of SCCD.

The investigation also found the director

conducted personal business during work hours by teaching multiple first aid classes without the knowledge of county officials. From July 2022 through June 2023, the director did not record 64 annual leave hours for classes he instructed for his personal business during county work hours.

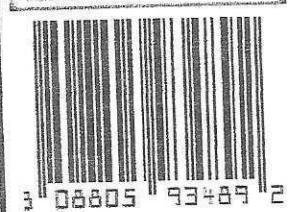

James Parks, 57, Beals Chapel road Lenoir City, was charged with, Reckless Endangerment, and Vandalism.

James Newell, 37, McDaniel Lane Lenoir City, was charged with Violation of Probation.

Deputy Willis LCSO, along with Cpl. Sartin 939 responded to an Officer investigation at Old Bailey Road. Upon arrival, deputies made contact with the Complainant/Victim, who explained to deputies that his dog had been shot by James Parks Offender/Arrestee earlier in the night after his dog and Mr. Parks' dog got into a fight at Beals Chapel Road. The victim said he was visiting around 12:00 a.m. when the dogs began to fight. The victim said he and James Newell Offender/

Arrestee were trying to separate the dogs when Mr. Parks fired a rifle in the air in an attempt to get the dogs to stop. The victim said he then yelled for Mr. Parks to not shoot his dog. The victim said Mr. Parks then aimed the rifle at his dog and shot, hitting the dog in the shoulder. The victim did have injuries to his wrist and leg from trying to separate the dogs. Deputy and Cpl. Sartin left the Old Bailey's residence and traveled to Beals Chapel in an attempt to make contact with the other parties. Once we arrived we were able to make contact with both Mr. Newell and Mr. Parks. During our investigation, Mr. Parks explained that he woke up to the sound of dogs fighting. He exited the van that he stays in with his Ruger Ar-15 (serial number 855-17624) and fired two rounds into the

bank in an attempt to get them to stop. Mr. Parks then said he fired one round toward the dogs. At this time the victim had just dropped his dog causing the dog to fall to the ground where Mr. Parks fired the round. Mr. Parks said he was not intending to shoot the dog. Due to the above statements, Mr. Parks was taken into custody for Reckless Endangerment and Vandalism. The rifle used was taken for evidence along with a magazine with 23 rounds of .556. While speaking

with Mr. Newell he told us that Mr. Parks did fire two rounds into the ground and one more shot towards the dogs. Deputy did run a warrant check on Mr. Newell and Mr. Parks through Loudon County Dispatch. Mr. Newell came back with a 4th Violation of Probation docket number 2019-Cr-135 and 2019-CR-104. Mr. Newell was taken into custody for this said warrant. Both Mr. Newell and Mr. Parks were transported to Loudon County Jail without further incident.

Kristi Burchfield, 47, Steekee School Road Loudon, was charged with, Simple Possession, and Poss. of Drug Para.

Lonie Farmer, 38, Hwy 11 N Sweetwater, was charged with Contraband in Penal Institution, and Public Intoxication.

Deputy A. Gann LCSO, observed a black Toyota Camry bearing a Tn. registration of 428BKMY with a license plate cover obstructing the view of the license plate around the registration. Deputy initiated his emergency lights to make a traffic stop on the vehicle at Highway 72 and Maremont Parkway. The vehicle then turned right onto Maremont Parkway and then made a left turn onto Clark Street coming to a stop behind the McGill Click Funeral Home. Ms. Burchfield was then taken into custody at that time for being in possession of a Schedule II narcotic. Mr. Farmer was then taken into custody due to his behavior being observed by multiple officers and was found to be unsafe to himself or the

public and was believed to be under the influence of an unknown narcotic substance. Mr. Farmer was also found to have approximately 1.8 grams of white powder believed to be methamphetamine wrapped in a clear baggie during a strip search inside the jail.
