FBI Internship Program Gives Wounded Warriors a Window into Bureau Careers

Program lets qualified troops work at Headquarters or field offices

A unique FBI internship program gives our nation's wounded warriors the chance to explore careers with the Bureau—and potentially become permanent members of the FBI family.

The FBI Wounded Warrior Internship Program offers current U.S. military servicemembers who are re-

covering from medical procedures or injuries the opportunity to intern at Bureau Headquarters or at one of our 56 field offices nationwide.

Interns can strengthen their resumes, cultivate new skillsets, discover new professional interests, and get federal government work experience while they're still in uniform. "We try to place them in an area where it'll be exciting and relevant and to have them gain exposure to what the FBI truly has to offer," said Program Manager Marimar Keffer, a former member of the Air National Guard and current Air Force reservist.

In addition to bringing "a fresh perspective" to the Bureau, Keffer said, these interns come equipped with intelligence and cybersecurity skills that are vital to the FBI mission.

District Attorney General Russell Johnson (9th District) is announcing that, after consulting with General Charme Allen the pursuing law enforcement (Knox County) and General Ryan Desmond (Blount County), he has predicated the Tennessee Bureau of Investigation to investigate the apparent death of an adult male subject that occurred on Hwy 321 near Eaton's Crossroads in Lenoir City. At 321, responded and arrived on least three law enforcement agencies were involved either in the pursuit or 'apprehension' of the now deceased subject.

According to information available at this point, Knox County deputies may have approached the subject who was threatening suicide and the subject pointed his gun at deputies and then fled. A pursuit ensued through Knox County and the subject travelled into Loudon County on I-75 southbound and turned onto Hwy 321 at the Lenoir City exit (Exit 81) and travelled towards Eaton's

Crossroads (Hwy 321/Hwy 70) where he attempted to make a U-turn at Parkway Drive. The subject's vehicle ended up in a ditch and he was surrounded by officers at approximately 1:00 pm. Members of the Blount County Sheriff's Office, whose tactical team just happened to be training with Loudon County Sheriff's Office off of Williams Ferry Road and Hwy the scene within minutes. They used their Bearcat (armored tactical vehicle) to approach the subject who was still in the driver's seat of his car. The tactical unit fired non-lethal rounds into the vehicle, according to Loudon County Sheriff Jimmy Davis.

It was determined that the subject was not moving, so officers approached the vehicle to find the subject possibly deceased with a handgun in his lap. EMS was called and began life saving measures. The subject was then transported to


Fort Loudoun Medical Center Forensics Center and any offiin Lenoir City where he was declared deceased at 1:58 pm.

Because of the multiple law enforcement agencies involved from three counties and the fact that the subject was technically 'in custody' at the time of his apparent suicide, the TBI was 'predicated' to handle the investigation. An autopsy will be performed at the Knox County

cial cause of death will be determined after a review of the autopsy and the TBI investigation.

North Middle and Eaton Elementary were placed on a soft lockdown due to their close proximity to the incident. Karns High School in Knox County was also placed on a soft lockdown during the pursuit.

"Offering this internship is a way to remind servicemembers that they're not forgotten, that after they retire—whether medically or voluntarily—there is another chapter for them. Their story isn't over. They can take all those skills, their job, and their life experiences and move them to the next chapter with the FBI," Keffer said.

Interns are evaluated each month, she said, and the FBI aims to offer them permanent jobs once they successfully complete their internships.

An Intern's Story

During his time with the U.S. Navy, Gabriel Moorer primarily worked at-sea aboard the USS Dwight D. Eisenhower until he was sidelined by lower-back injuries.

The IT systems technician was then reassigned to a land-based squadron in Norfolk, Virginia, where a coworker told him about the FBI's Wounded Warrior Internship Program.

Moorer reached out to Operation Warfighter, attended a WWIP interest session, and then decided to apply. When he eventually met with his future boss at the FBI Norfolk Field Office, he said they "kind of clicked right off the bat," and a start date was set. Soon after, Moorer went to work supporting the division's Joint Terrorism Task Force.

During his time at the Bureau, Moorer honed his time- and project-management skills, since FBI personnel are trusted to work independently to accomplish tasks. "Especially as an enlisted member of the military, you're not really given that opportunity as much," Moorer said.

He was also impressed by the expertise and experiences of his FBI colleagues. 'I think the most rewarding part was actually just talking to people," he said. 'I learned so much from agents and support staff through the whole process."

Moorer, who recently retired from the Navy and concluded his internship, encourages fellow wound warriors to ap-

ply, nothing that "I don't think there's a better program for you to go get on-the-job experience, exchange knowledge with other people who are very knowledgeable, and get an excellent job opportunity that could end up being the perfect career for you

Eligibility

The FBI Wounded Warrior Internship Program is part of the Defense Department's Operation Warfighter program. This DOD initiative links wounded warriors with federal government internships so that they can gain work experience while recuperating from a wound, illness, or injury.

The program is incredibly competitive, but at this time, there's no limit on the number of qualified servicemembers who may be selected for internships each year, Keffer said. Thirteen FBI interns are expected to onboard by the end of fiscal year 2023, according to the program.

As long as a field office or Headquarters division has an operational need—and if they believe an applicant is the right fit for the position—the FBI's Human Resources Division will make the match.

To qualify for the program, a servicemember must:

Be an active-duty servicemember, a mobilized reservist, or a member of the Army or Air National Guard

Be a U.S. citizen

Be assigned to a Wounded Warrior unit, detachment, or regiment

Hold an active Top Secret security clearance

Have at least six months remaining on their service commitment

Have the ability to travel to and from their assigned worksite

Meet FBI security and suitability requirements






