More cases reported in E. coli outbreak linked to McDonald's Quarter Pounders; Taylor Farms recalls onions sent to restaurants

An update to CDC's Food Safety Alert regarding an outbreak of E. coli infections linked to McDonald's Quarter Pounders has been posted: <https://www.cdc.gov/ecoli/outbreaks/e-coli-O157.html>

Key Points:
Since October 22, 2024

- o 26 new illnesses have been reported, bringing the total to

75.
o 3 new states (Michigan, New Mexico, Washington) have been added to the number of states where sick people live, bringing the total to 13 states.

- o 12 more people have been hospitalized, bringing the total to 22. This number includes the previously reported death in Colorado and child with complications of hemolytic uremic syndrome, or HUS,

and 1 new HUS in an adult.

- o The most recent illness on-set date is October 10, 2024.

Of 42 people interviewed, all 42 reported eating at McDonald's before their illness started, and most specifically mentioned eating a Quarter Pounder hamburger. No other retail chains

Angel De Aquino, 32, Reeds Spring Road Philadelphia, was charged with, DUI, and Driving without License.

Deputy Brockwell LCSO, observed a vehicle on Highway 11, going towards Monroe County, driving on the shoulder. The deputy caught up to the vehicle and observed the vehicle driving at a slow rate of speed. The deputy initiated a traffic stop and when he approached the vehicle, the deputy came in contact with the driver Angel Lino De Aquino. While speaking to De Aquino, the deputy noticed a strong

odor of an alcoholic beverage coming from his person. The deputy asked De Aquino if he had a driver's license. De Aquino proceeded to look through his wallet dropping it multiple times and then handing the deputy 3 different ID cards, none were a valid driver's license. The deputy asked him if he had consumed any alcoholic beverages, and he stated that he had 2 beers. The deputy asked De Aquino to step out of the vehicle and he failed to maintain his balance almost falling multiple times. The deputy then attempted to ask if he would be okay with performing some testing to ensure he was safe to operate

a motor vehicle on a public roadway. There was a language barrier so De Aquino was having a hard time understanding the testing and it was not completed. Based on the totality of the circumstances, the deputy placed De Aquino under arrest for Driving Under the Influence and driving with no license. The vehicle was towed by James Towing and the depu-

ty then transported De Aquino to the Loudon County Detention Facility. While at the jail, Deputy Rivera translated the implied consent advisement form. De Aquino consented to give a breath sample which was performed at the Loudon County Detention Facility. The results of the test showed that De Aquino blew a .150 with the legal limit being a .08.

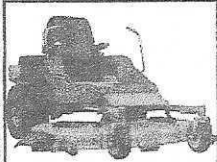

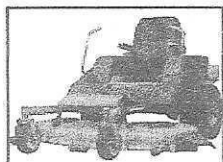



William Malone, 36, Breezeway Drive Knoxville, was charged with, Mfg/Del/Sale or Poss. of Meth, Poss. of Drug Para., and General Session Capias.

Deputy Willis LCSO, was traveling South on Old Highway 95 when the deputy observed a Ford Van with no working brake lights. Loudon County Dispatch confirmed the registration had been expired since November of 2023. The deputy initiated a traffic stop at 95 Market and made contact with the Driver/Offender William Malone. Mr. Malone showed nervous behavior such as erratic speech and stuttering. Mr. Malone was aware of the registration being expired and lights not working. The deputy ran Mr. Malone's driver's license

through the Loudon County Dispatch for status and local warrants. While still seated in the vehicle the deputy asked Mr. Malone for consent to search the vehicle. Mr. Malone hesitated for a minute before answering no. The deputy had Mr. Malone exit the vehicle and accompany me to the front of my patrol vehicle while the deputy started his citation process. While speaking with Mr. Malone he did make the deputy aware that he had a prior narcotic history. Deputy Curtis arrived on scene and deployed K-9 Loki on the vehicle. Deputy Curtis advised that his K9 partner alerted to the driver-side window of the vehicle. Deputy Curtis and Deputy Knight conducted a probable cause search of the vehicle. During the probable cause search, Deputy Curtis lo-

cated a metal tin between the driver seat and center console containing two baggies of what we believed to be methamphetamine. Deputy Knight located two grinders with Marijuana residue as well as a glass pipe commonly used to smoke methamphetamine and a rolling tray with a roller. Dispatch confirmed he had a local warrant for Failure to Appear in Sessions Court of Loudon County docket number 2015-CR-486. The deputy

took Mr. Malone into custody and transported him to the Loudon County Detention Facility for the active warrant, as well as Manufacture, Delivery, Sale, or Possession of Meth and Possession of Drug Paraphernalia. Narcotics Investigators did test the substance via TruNarc and it did test positive for Methamphetamine and weighed 4.7 grams. This did occur in Loudon County Tennessee.





or retailers have been identified as a source of illness.

The specific ingredient linked to illness has not yet been confirmed as the source, but investigators continue to focus on two ingredients in particular: fresh slivered onions, and fresh beef patties.

Taylor Farms, the supplier of slivered onions for affected McDonald's locations, initiated a recall of yellow onions. Stores were contacted directly and asked to remove products. FDA is working closely with the implicated farms and will continue to provide updates including any additional recalls that might be needed for businesses who received recalled onions.

Due to the product actions taken by McDonald's and Taylor Farms, CDC believes the continued risk to the public is very low.

What You Should Do:

If you have severe symptoms of E. coli infection, seek health care, and tell your provider about what you ate.

Businesses should not use recalled onions supplied by Taylor Farms.

E. coli Symptoms:

Most people infected with Shiga toxin-producing E. coli experience severe stomach cramps, diarrhea (often bloody), and vomiting.

o Symptoms usually start 3 to 4 days after swallowing the bacteria.

o Most people recover without treatment after 5 to 7 days.

Some people may develop serious kidney problems (hemolytic uremic syndrome, also called HUS) and would need to be hospitalized.

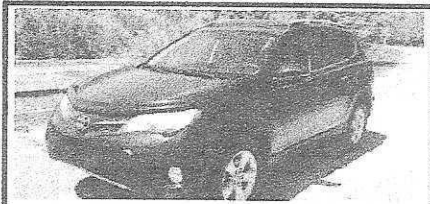

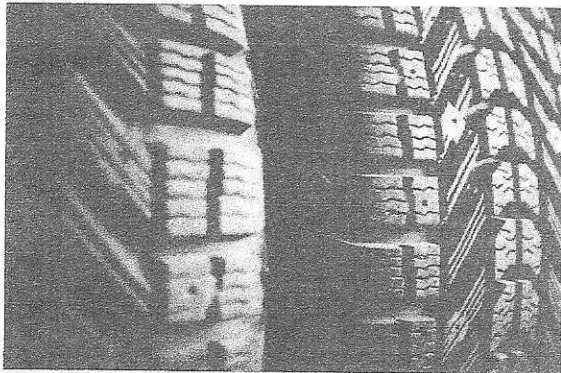
