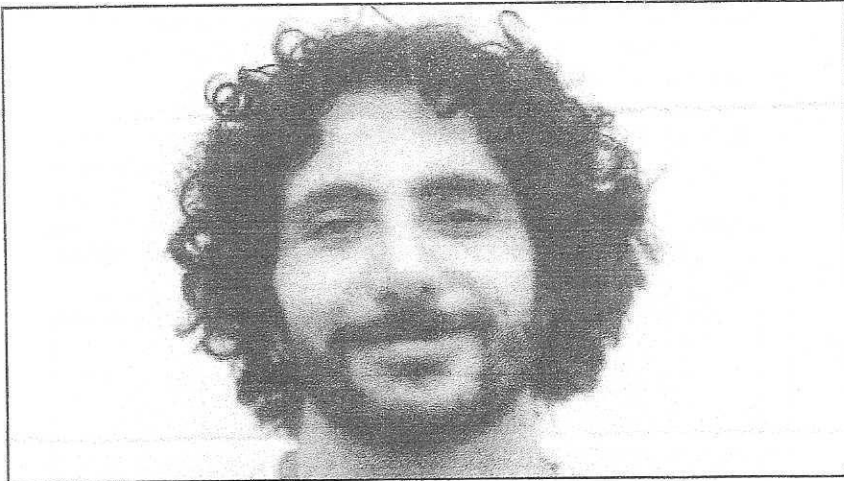

## #StopRansomware: BianLian Data Extortion Group

The Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI), Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency (CISA), and the Australian Signals Directorate's Australian Cyber Security Centre (ASD's ACSC) are releasing this joint Cybersecurity Advisory to disseminate known BianLian ransomware and data extortion group IOCs and TTPs iden-

tified through FBI and ASD's ACSC investigations.

(New, November 20, 2024) The reporting agencies are aware of multiple ransomware groups, like BianLian, that seek to misattribute location and nationality by choosing foreign-language names, almost

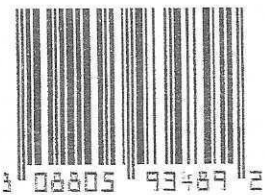

### Agg. Assault

William Nicholson, 24, rest Camp Road Lenoir City, was charged with Aggravated Assault.

Deputy T. Branson LCSO, responded to Rest Camp Road

to a camper that sits on this property, for a domestic disturbance. Upon arrival, a male, later identified as Mr. William Nicholson, leaned out the window of the camper and began screaming at deputies and the victim who was outside, later

identified as his girlfriend/victim. Mr. Nicholson exited the camper and threatened the victim, saying he would hurt her if he went to jail. The deputy detained Mr. Nicholson at that time. Deputies made contact with the victim, who stated that she and Mr. Nicholson got into a verbal argument; Mr. Nicholson grabbed the victim around the throat and attempted to choke her after a dispute over \$4.00. Mr. Nicholson released the victim and threw her back into the children's playpen while the children were inside the residence. The victim then called Mr. Nicholson's mother, at which time Mr. Nicholson approached her and slapped her in the face. Sgt. Pesterfield did observe that the victim

neck was red, with scratches consistent with this version of the events. When asked what happened, Mr. Nicholson stated that no assault occurred, and the two only argued. Due to the totality of the circumstances, it was determined a domestic assault occurred with Mr. Nicholson being the primary aggressor, and he was placed in custody at that time. The victim was advised how to obtain an order of protection but declined further assistance related to domestic violence. Due to the children present at the time of this event, a DCS referral was completed. DCS referral number: 1-493351219. Mr. Nicholson was then transported to the Loudon County Jail without incident.

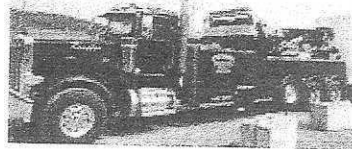

**Charged**

Gordon Narmore, 44, Morton Lane Lenoir City, was charged with Domestic Assault, and Interference with 911 Emergency.

Deputy B. McCall LCSO, responded to a domestic disturbance at Morton Lane. Upon arrival, the deputy observed the offender, Gordon Narmore, entering the front of the residence from the porch. The victim, was seated at a patio table on the front porch. The deputy could hear Mr. Narmore yelling inside the home. The deputy entered through the front door and instructed Mr. Narmore to step outside. The deputy then asked him what had occurred.

Mr. Narmore stated that he, his girlfriend, and their child live at this address with his girlfriend grandmother. He explained that he had been working on the grandmother truck when she came out and started arguing with him. He further explained that he became angry and broke some items on the porch that he had purchased. The deputy observed a fresh cut on Mr. Narmore's right hand, but he could not explain how the injury occurred. The vic-

tim, and a witness, provided the following statements: the victim stated that Mr. Narmore had taken her truck, and while she was taking out the garbage, he came speeding down the driveway.

As she was preparing to leave with her sister to go to the doctor, she asked Mr. Narmore for the keys to the truck so her brother could pick it up for repairs. At that moment, she said Mr. Narmore became irate, threw a rocking chair into the bookcase, breaking the glass, and then went out onto the front porch. Once on the porch, he continued to throw and break items. The victim attempted to call 911, but Mr. Narmore took her phone, threw it, and threatened to burn her house down. She also told deputies that Mr. Narmore pushed her, and in response, she pushed him away.

The witness provided a statement consistent with the victim account, but added that when Mr. Narmore threw the victim phone, she left the residence to call for help and wait for the police. Based on the facts stated above, The deputy took him into custody.

This incident occurred in Loudon County, TN.

Daniel Osborne, 28, Church Street Loudon, was charged with, DUI, and Possession of Handgun while Under the Influence.

Deputy Ezell LCSO, was traveling on Highway 321 when he observed a white Jeep Compass traveling at a high rate of speed. While attempting to catch up to the vehicle the deputy observed the vehicle traveling approximately 50 miles per hour in a 30 mile per hour zone and the deputy observed the vehicle almost strike a curb. The deputy conducted a traffic stop on the vehicle at Ervin's Body Shop located at 1870 Highway 11 West where he made contact with the driver identified as Daniel

Osborne. While speaking with Mr. Osborne, the deputy observed Mr. Osborne to have glassy eyes and the deputy detected the odor of an alcoholic beverage coming from his person. 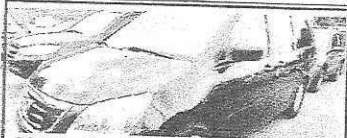

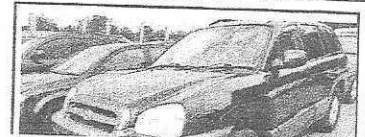

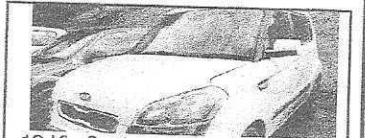

Officer Garren LCPD, with Officer Fine and Officer Sparks, were dispatched on a call for service of a do-

Francisco explained that they got into an argument, that turned into a fight, where he tried to grab victim arm. Francisco stated that the victim pulled his arm away and shoved him into a wall and he hurt his shoulder. Francisco admitted to scratching the victim in the face and

grabbing at him out of anger. Officer Sparks and Fine did notice that Francisco was visually in a lot of pain when interviewing and favoring his right arm. Emergency medical services were dispatched to check out with Francisco. Officers determined the Primary aggressor and placed Francisco in custody. Francisco was transported to Fort Loudon Medical Center for further evaluation before being transported to the Loudon Count Jail. The above did occur in Lenoir City, Loudon County, TN

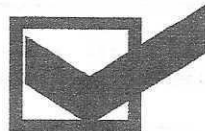

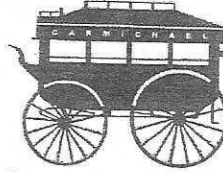

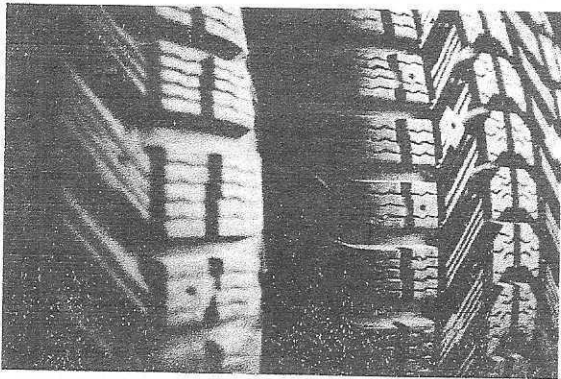
