## TBI's 'Operation Autumn Shield' Yields Ten Arrests, Identifies 19 Online Sexual Exploitation & Sextortion Child Victims

Ten people face felony charges and more than a dozen victims have been identified in a large-scale, collaborative operation to target online child exploitation and sextortion in Tennessee.

Over a three-month period, from October through December, the Tennessee Bureau of Investigation's Internet Crimes Against Children (ICAC) Task Force, housed within the Cybercrime and Digital Evidence Unit

(CDEU), conducted "Operation Autumn Shield". The purpose of this operation was to identify and locate children who were victims of sextortion and online sexual exploitation, and to identify and arrest individuals whose goal is to harm children online. "Operation Autumn Shield" resulted in 19 child victims being identified and located as victims of online sexual exploitation and sextortion, and 10 subjects arrested on various internet crimes against children.

This operation included an instance involving artificial intelligence, where a male subject used AI technology applications to produce an image of his minor daughter into a nude photograph, and shared it online. Agents also identified and located a 14-year-old male who founded "101", an online extremist group that extorts minors into self-harm and producing child sexual abuse mate-

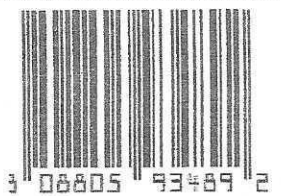

### DUI

Breanna Countryman, 36, Dogwood Valley Road Kingston, was charged with DUI.

Deputy Allen LCSO, performed a traffic stop on a silver Nissan Rogue on Thornton Drive. The deputy had witnessed the vehicle on Highway 70 traveling at 62MPH in a marked 45MPH zone. The deputy caught up to the vehicle and it pulled onto Thornton Drive as the deputy activated his emergency lights. The vehicle then pulled off the right side of the road

placing all four tires in the grass field next to the road. Upon approach to the driver's side front window, the deputy came into contact with Breanna Countryman driving the vehicle. Ms. Countryman had a strong smell of alcoholic beverages coming from her breath and glassy eyes. Ms. Countryman admits she had 2 drinks earlier tonight. Ms. Countryman agreed to perform standardized field sobriety testing. Ms. Countryman had a lack of smooth pursuit in both eyes, distinct and sustained nystagmus

at maximum deviation in both eyes, and the onset of nystagmus prior to 45 degrees in both eyes. During the walk and turn Ms. Countryman started too soon, missed heel-to-toe on every step, performed an improper turn, and used her arms for balance. During the one-leg stand, Ms. Countryman used her arms for balance and put her foot down. Based on my observation of the vehicle in motion, Ms. Countryman's performance on the SFSTs, and her own admission to consuming alcohol prior to driving, the deputy concluded

that Ms. Countryman was under the influence of an intoxicant that impaired her ability to safely operate a motor vehicle on a public roadway, and she was taken into custody for driving under the influence. Ms. Countryman was read the implied consent advisement and agreed to a blood draw. She was transported to Fort Loudoun Medical Center for a blood draw without incident. After the blood draw, Ms. Countryman was transported to the Loudon County Jail without incident. This did occur in Loudon County TN.

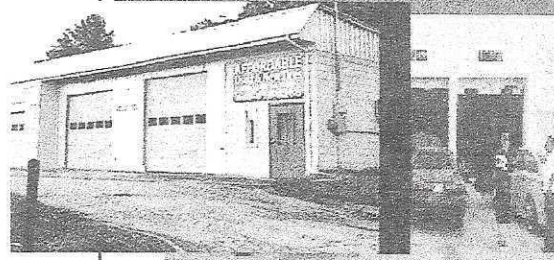

Kimberly Adams, 51, Rocky Ridge Drive Asheville, was charged with, Mfg/Del/Sale or Poss. of Meth, and Poss. of Drug Para.

Officer R. Miller, with the Lenoir City Police Department, conducted a traffic stop at Highway 321 (Dollar General) on a red Nissan sedan for a speeding violation, 64mph in a 55mph posted zone. Speed was captured on his in-car radar unit. Upon the traffic stop the driver was identified as Kimberly Adams. The officer then had ADAMS step out of the vehicle to speak with her further about a citation. During the roadside traffic stop, ADAMS admitted during the time the officer was writing the citation

that she had pulled into the Dollar General in attempts to avoid being located. During the traffic stop the officer requested for K9 Inv. C. Gray of the Loudon County Sheriff's Office respond to his location where he conducted an open-air sniff of the Nissan sedan with K9 Kora. The officer was informed by K9 Inv. C. Gray that K9 Kora had alerted to an odor of narcotics emitting from the vehicle. A probable cause search of the vehicle was then conducted. During the subsequent search of the vehicle, the officer located a glass bong underneath the passenger's seat in which had a pipe with a charred bottom sticking out from it which resembled a pipe commonly used to smoke metham-

phetamine with. The officer also located a small button pouch in the passenger's side door pocket which contained a small blue bag containing a crystal-like substance believed to be methamphetamine. The approximate weight of the crystal-like substance along with the blue bag it was contained in was (0.81 grams). During the search

there were also two cut straws located near the other contraband inside of the vehicle. Both ADAMS and the passenger were read their miranda warning at which time ADAMS stated the items located inside of the vehicle belonged to her. ADAMS was placed under arrest and transported to the Loudon County Jail without incident.

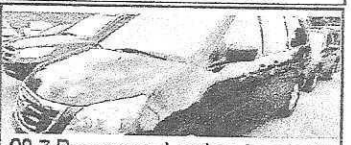

rial. The "101" is a spin-off of "764, which the Department of Justice describes as a network of violent extremists that seeks to normalize the production, sharing, and possession of child sexual abuse and gore material to corrupt and groom their victims toward future violence.

TBI ICAC Task Force Agents identified and located 14 known child victims of sextortion in Tennessee that were reported through NCMEC cybertips.

Agents are still attempting to identify and locate an additional 8 more children who are victims of sextortion. The ages of these children were 12-17 years old. Most of these victims were on social media platforms such as Instagram and Snapchat. These companies did make the initial report to NCMEC. Five of the 19 child victims were identified and rescued as they were victims of brand-new sexual exploitation content being created by the offender and shared on social media platforms.

The actions of this operation

extended to 19 counties in the state, including the work of 18 local, state, and federal law enforcement partners: Sequatchie County Sheriff's Department, Henry County Sheriff's Department, Paris Police Department, U.S. Homeland Security Investigations (HSI), Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI), Marion County Sheriff's Department, Robertson County Sheriff's Department, 12th Judicial Drug Task Force, Lawrence County Sheriff's Department, Polk County Sheriff's Department, Humbolt Police Department, Pickett County Sheriff's Department, 13th District Attorney's Office, 27th District Attorney's Office, Martin Police Department, Cannon County Sheriff's Department, Gibson County Sheriff's Department, and Lauderdale County Sheriff's Department.

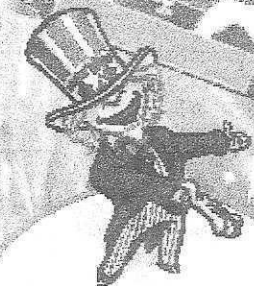

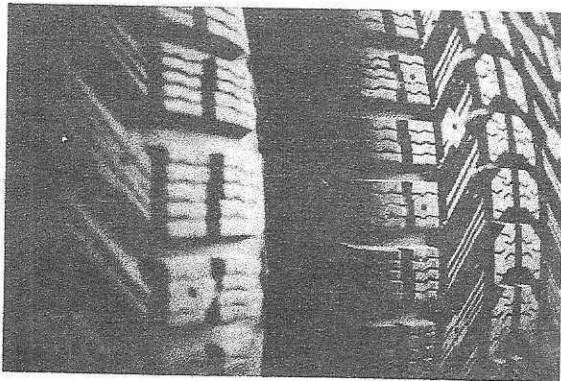
