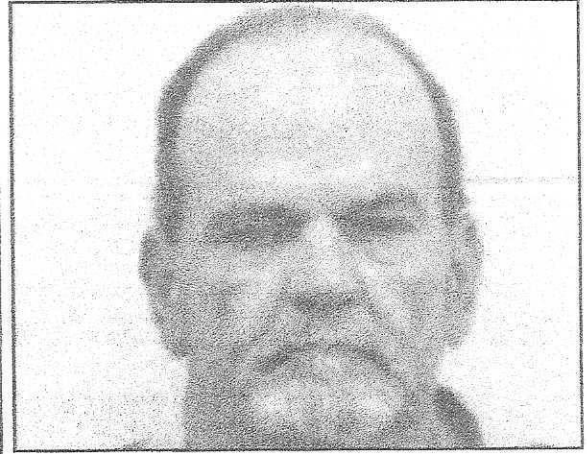

LOOKOUT MOUNTAIN MAN INDICTED FOR SEXUAL EXPLOITATION OF CHILDREN

A federal grand jury in Knoxville returned a three-count indictment against James C. Thompson, 71, of Lookout Mountain, Tennessee, for transporting minors with the intent to engage in sexual activity. Thompson appeared in court today before the Honorable United States Magistrate Judge Christopher H. Steger and entered a

plea of not guilty to the charges in the indictment. He is in custody pending trial, which has been set for August 12, 2024, in United States District Court, in Chattanooga, Tennessee, before the Honorable Travis R. McDonough, United States District Judge.

The indictment alleges that Thompson transported minors in interstate commerce

intending to engage in sexual activity with them in November and September 2000.

If convicted, Thompson faces a maximum term of 15 years in prison, up to a \$350,000 fine, and 3 years on supervised release.

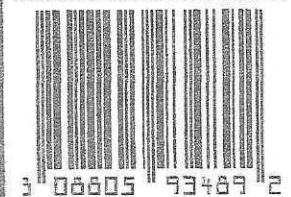

Agents from the 9th Drug Task Force, Homeland Security and Deputies from the Loudon County Sheriff's Office executed narcotics search warrant at Old Hwy 95, Lenoir City, TN. Agents have been conducting a narcotics investigation into Hector Garcia Almanza and the sale of illegal Sch. II narcotics at the residence. Almanza was taken into custody in the master bedroom of the res-

idence and after a search of that same room Agents located two different Sch. II narcotics. Located beside the bed were two bags and a folded piece of paper containing suspected cocaine (2.4 grams). Located in the closet of the bedroom was a plastic bag containing suspected methamphetamine (5.4 grams). Officer Valletto LPD, conducted a Traffic stop at the Loves Truck Stop after observing a vehicle driving on Elizabeth Lee with an expired registration that returned not on file. Upon contact with the driver of the vehicle Mr. Joseph Hodge could not produce the officer with the registration of the vehicle as it was last updated in 2013. Officer Valletto then asked Mr. Hodge to produce him with his drivers license in which he stated he did not have one. 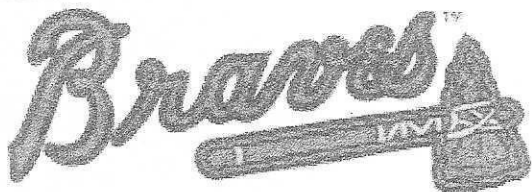

Deputy Allen LCSO, while on patrol was traveling on Jackson Bend road. As the deputy neared Jackson Bend Road he found two vehicles (a dark in color BMW and a red Acura) parked in the roadway both facing his patrol vehicle and blocking the roadway. The deputy activated his emergency equipment. The red Acura attempted to leave upon seeing his equipment activate. The

deputy was able to stop the vehicle with verbal commands. The vehicle was being operated by Brandon Johnson. Mr. Johnson was removed from his vehicle with verbal commands. As I was explaining to Mr. Johnson why he had been removed from his vehicle, the deputy could smell a strong odor of marijuana coming from his vehicle. Mr. Johnson Stated he had smoked in his vehicle earlier. The deputy explained to Mr. Johnson that he had probable cause to search his vehicle. Mr. Johnson went to his vehicle and

retrieved 2 bags. One contains a green leafy substance that Mr. Johnson states is Marijuana. The second contains Mushrooms that Mr. Johnson states are "Shrooms". Mr. Johnson was detained at this time and placed in his patrol unit. his vehicle was searched with no further findings. The deputy went to inform Mr. Johnson that he was under arrest. Upon the deputy telling Mr. Johnson of his arrest he stated that he had seen a baggie in the floor of the back of his patrol unit. The deputy asked where he had seen it and before the deputy could instruct him not to touch anything he bent into the floorboard on the driver's side. He then came up with a small baggie similar to the other two that contained a

white/clear crystal-like substance. Mr. Johnson then said, "I don't want this pinned on me". On 05/29/2024 the deputy attended in-service this was our gun qualification day. The deputy had transported personal equipment in the back seat of his patrol unit. After removing his items the deputy checked the back seat noting white powder on the floorboard from nicotine pouches he had dropped. The deputy found no other items in the back seat or on the floor. No one has been in the back seat since then. Mr. Johnson was transported to the Loudon County Jail without incident. The deputy did reinspect the back seat of his patrol Unit with nothing found.

The FBI believes there may be additional victims and is attempting to identify them. Potential victims most likely include males who were between the ages of 10 and 15 and may have been involved in various youth wrestling programs or youth hunting organizations. They or anyone else who believes that they were victimized by Thompson, or anyone who may have information about potential victims fitting this description can contact the Chattanooga FBI Office at 423-265-3601 or report it at tips.fbi.gov.

This indictment is the result of an investigation by the Federal Bureau of Investigation, the Jackson County, Alabama Sheriff's Office, and the Lookout Mountain, Ten-

nessee Police Department.

Assistant U.S. Attorney James Brooks represents the United States.

This case was brought as part of Project Safe Childhood, a nationwide initiative launched in May 2006 by the Department of Justice to combat the growing epidemic of child sexual exploitation and abuse. Led by the United States Attorneys' Offices and the Criminal Division's
