Tennessee Man Sentenced to 20 Years in Prison for Attempting to Provide Material Support to ISIS

Benjamin Carpenter, also known as Abu Hamza, 34, of Knoxville, Tennessee, was sentenced today to 20 years in prison followed by 20 years of supervised release for attempting to provide material support to the Islamic State of Iraq and al-Sham (ISIS) in connection with providing translation services to ISIS, a designated foreign

terrorist organization. "For years, this defendant led a global digital media operation to distribute pro-ISIS propaganda, promoting the group's radical message of terror and pushing it to every corner of the world," said Assistant Attorney General Matthew G. Olsen of the Justice Department's National Security Division. "Today's sentence reflects the seriousness of this

defendant's conduct and the Justice Department's commitment to identifying and holding accountable those who would provide material support to foreign terrorist organizations."

"Combating terrorism and keeping our communities safe are the highest priorities of the United States

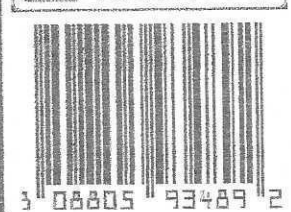

Laura Kinsler, 54, Martins Creek Road TN. was charged with, DUI, Violation of Implied Consent, Driving on Revoked/Suspended License, Mfg/Del/Sale or Poss. of Meth, Man/Sell/Del/Resale Sch. III, & IV, Mfg/Sell/Poss. of Controlled Substance, Simple Possession, Poss. of Drug Para., and Open Container.

Charles Whitson, 68, Stockyard Road TN., was charged with Mfg/Sell/Del/Resale Sch. IV, and Violation of Sex Offender Registry.

Deputy Reagan LCSO, responded to Ace Hardware store in reference to a reckless driver that had entered the county from Knox County. Upon arrival, the deputy made contact with Charles Whitson (Arrestee), in a black Ford Mustang, he stated that he and Laura Kinsler (Arrestee) came from a hotel in Knox County and were attempting to find an address on Center Park Drive in Knoxville. Whitson stated that they were heading to a court order DUI class for Kinsler. Whitson stated that he had just gotten into the driver seat when Kinsler entered Ace to use the restroom. He stated that she had been driving up to that point, and the way she was driving scared him.

While speaking with him, the deputy observed a small bottle of Fireball in the center console. The deputy had Whitson exit the vehicle to further investigate. K9 Deputy Curtis arrived on scene while speaking with Whitson. Deputy Curtis and and Reagan observed a female that fit the description given by Whitson approach the doors of Ace from the inside and as we entered, she walked away toward the back of the building. The deputy was able to identify her and we exited the building. When she opened her purse, the deputy observed an orange pill bottle without any labeling. While speaking with her, the deputy could smell the odor of an alcoholic beverage emitting from her person, her speech was slurred, and she had difficulty forming sentences. Kinsler admitted to driving the black Mustang from the hotel to Ace hardware. A few bystanders spoke to the deputy aside and stated that they observed her at the red light at Kingston Pike and Watt Rd stopped in the middle of the roadway and nearly hitting other vehicles on the road when she did take off. Kinsler consented to SFST and she performed poorly. Kinsler was placed into custody and read implied consent,


and she refused to give blood for chemical testing. Kinsler consented to a search of her black purse. While searching, the deputy found 3.5 tablets of Suboxone accompanied by a cut straw, 1 800mg Gabapentin, and 1 Klonopin tablet, all of which were not in proper prescription bottles. The deputy also found a glass pipe used for smoking methamphetamine, 1.19g of suspected methamphetamine, and 1.2g of suspected marijuana. Kinsler was read her Miranda Rights and consented to questioning. She admitted that the narcotics found were hers. Deputy Slemph arrived on scene and helped identify all of the narcotics that were found. Deputy Curtis deployed his partner K9 Loki, and a positive alert was identified at the drivers side window. A probable Cause search was conducted on the vehicle and more small bottles of Fireball, individually

packaged hemp, and pipes were found. Deputy Reagan transported Kinsler to the Loudon County Jail.

Deputy Curtis contacted CID4 Mills regarding Whitson's status as a Sex Offender and he was able to get us in touch with Washington County's investigator Lt. Vince Walters, that heads their registry. Lt Walters stated that Whitson did not contact them and get approval before going on the trip with Kinsler therefore violated supervisory status. Whitson was placed into custody and while Deputy Slemph searched him, 7 Tramadol tablets and 19 Tizanidine tablets were located in his pocket inside of an unmarked blue pills container. A taser and condoms were also located with the narcotics. At that time, Whitson was transported by Deputy Slemph to the Loudon County Jail. This did happen in Loudon County, TN.

Deputy Billy Freeman
LCSO, was dispatched to
Fork Creek Road for a suspi-
cious person. Upon arriving,
the deputy made contact with
the victim, who was limping,
favoring his right leg. The
victim said that his girlfriend
had ran over him with a car
and then drove off in a blue
Nissan Quest. After calming
the victim down, he started
to tell the deputy that he had
been at his boss's house on
Hwy 11 near the VFW when
his girlfriend, Breana Clark,
had picked him up. He said
when they were almost to
Corinth Church Road, they
had started arguing, Brea-
na started slapping him, he
jumped out of the car, and
when he did, she ran over his
leg. He said that she tried to

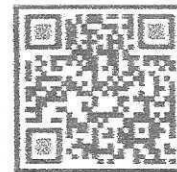

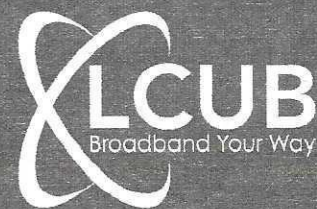

Agg. Burglary

Juan Almanza, 36, Church Drive Lenoir City, was charged with Aggravated Burglary, Assault x2, and Resisting Arrest.

Officers with the Lenoir City Police Dept. were advised of a B&E happening at Church Dr. The victim, advised a male with face tattoos, beige shorts and fluorescent t-shirt was inside her residence attempting to force his way into her and her sons bedroom. The victim advised she and her son, were sleeping when she heard a distur-

bance in the living room area. The victim continued to say, when she cautiously peaked through the bedroom door opening, she saw a male inside the residence without her effective consent. The male later identified as, Juan Manuel Almanza abruptly forced his way into her bedroom. By doing so, ALAMANZA knowingly caused victim and the child reasonable fear of imminent bodily injury, as well as intentionally and knowingly causing extremely offensive physical contact. During the investigation,

the victim described a Hispanic male that matched the description of Juan Manuel Almanza who resides at Church DR. The victim was able to identify the male after being shown A LCSO booking photo of ALMANZA. At approximately 1008 hrs. Officer Eldridge made contact with, ALMANZA at the intersection of Church DR and McFalls LN. Officers advised

ALMANZA of his Miranda Rights during the field interview. ALAMANZA, voluntarily waved his rights to counsel and agreed to speak to the units on scene. During the custodial interrogation, ALMANZA admitted he was the male inside of the victim residence. Consequently, ALAMZANA was placed under arrest and transported to the Loudon County Jail

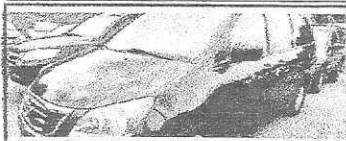

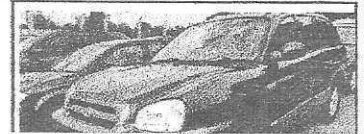

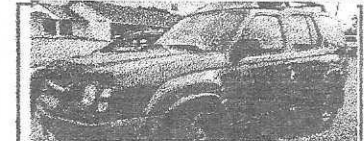

Attorney's Office," said U.S. Attorney Francis M. Hamilton III for the Eastern District of Tennessee. "This case deals a serious blow to the expansion of ISIS and its broken message of hatred and senseless violence."

"With today's sentencing, Carpenter is being held accountable for betraying his country and helping ISIS terrorists," said Executive Assistant Director Robert Wells of the FBI's National Security Branch. "He led a propaganda machine which called for war against U.S. and allied forces through suicide bombings and other means. The FBI and our partners will relentlessly pursue and bring to justice terrorists who devote their lives to hurting American citizens."

According to court documents, on Oct. 19, 2023, following an eight-day trial in U.S. District Court, a

jury convicted Carpenter of attempting to provide material support to ISIS. The evidence presented at trial demonstrated that Carpenter served as the leader of Ahlut-Tawhid Publications, an international organization of pro-ISIS "munasirin" (i.e., supporters), dedicated to translating, producing and distributing ISIS propaganda throughout the world. For years, Carpenter, using his alias Abu Hamza, published a large body of ISIS media, including his weekly newsletter entitled From Dabiq to Rome, a periodical that celebrated the deaths of American soldiers, glorified suicide bombers and called for open war against the United States and its Western allies, among other pro-ISIS propaganda themes. In 2020 and 2021, Carpenter contacted an individual he believed to be affiliated with ISIS' central media bureau and provided transla-

tion services for a project intended to relaunch Al-Hayat Media Center, ISIS' official foreign-language media arm. Unbeknownst to him, that individual was an FBI undercover employee who had infiltrated Carpenter's group.

The FBI Knoxville Field Office is investigating the case, with assistance from

FBI Field Offices from across the country.

Assistant U.S. Attorneys Kyle J. Wilson and Casey T. Arrowood for the Eastern District of Tennessee and Trial Attorney Charles J. Kovats Jr. of the National Security Division's Counterterrorism Section prosecuted the case.

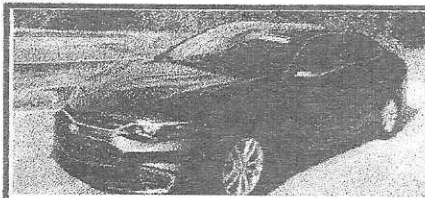

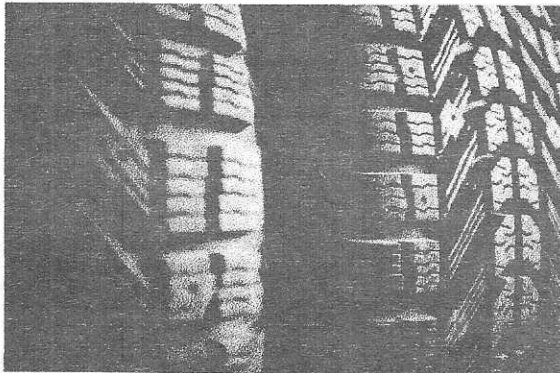
