Officer R. Miller, with the Lenoir City Police Department, was in the area of Chick Fil A located in Lenoir City, TN. While in the Chick Fil A parking lot the officer observed a black in color KIA sedan traveling through the parking lot. While observing the vehicle the officer visually observed that both brake lights were not functioning properly. The officer then initiated a traffic stop on the KIA sedan in the back parking lot of Chick Fil A. Upon the traffic stop the officer made contact with the driver, later identified to be Phillip Pannell. PHILLIP stated during the traffic stop that he did not have a license and that his license was suspended. The officer then had PHILLIP step out of the vehicle to speak with him further about a citation. During this time, the officer asked PHILLIP if he could search his pockets where he gave verbal con-

sent. The officer visually observed a blue cut straw that had a powder like residue inside of it sticking out of his front left pocket. Located inside of the bag were several small bags containing a gray powder-like residue believed to be fentanyl along with (1) cut straw containing the same gray powder-like residue.

### Disturbance

Cody Hamilton, 28, East Coast Tellico Parkway Greenback, was charged with, Criminal Trespass, and Resisting Arrest.

Deputy Harrison LCSO, was dispatched to the area of Wind River Golf Club a private gated community in reference to a male walking inside the gate that was not supposed to be there, screaming and yelling at vehicles. Dispatch advised the male was trying to push on the gate as it closed while he was leaving the area. Deputy Freeman made contact with the complainant at the entrance to the neighborhood in the guard shack while Harrison stayed in the area of Highway 321 attempting to locate the male. Deputy Harrison made contact with the subject later identified as Cody Hamilton on Highway 321 at Antioch Church

Hamilton lived in the community to which he stated no. The complaint stated at this point Hamilton continued to cuss at him and made a threat to harm him. Based on the facts above, Hamilton was placed in custody for resisting arrest and criminal trespass. This did occur in Loudon County, TN.

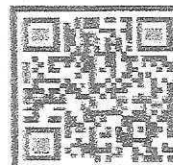

Christina Devaney, 37, Shaw Ferry Road Lenoir City, was charged with Simple Possession x2.

Officer G. Butler LCPD, was dispatched to Walmart in reference to a shoplifter. Upon arrival, the officer made contact with Walmart's A.P. Associates who advised that she had witnessed the above listed offender Christina Lee Devaney conceal multiple items in her bag in the hunting and fishing area of the store and then proceed to under scan

numerous items in the self checkout on the GM side after switching price tags on those items before passing all possible points of sale and then proceeded to exit through the GM doors. A.P. then made contact with the listed offender after she passed all points of sale and she was then detained until Law Enforcement's arrival. that Hannah has been seeing someone else recently and that she had left an Apple Watch at the residence and came back around 21:30 hours from her shift at Walmart because she accused him of looking through her stuff and wanted to get the watch from him. At which point the victim stated that Hannah began to yell through the door of his bedroom about getting the watch from him and that she said "I'll break this door down". During the investigation the door to the victim's bedroom was observed laying in the floor off the hinges. The victim then stated that it had become physical at that time and when speaking with officer Butler and Officer J. Robinson numerous lacerations were observed on the victim back, right leg and right ankle caused by the offender. Other units on scene spoke with

Hannah who advised that she had been staying at the residence to get back on her feet again and that the victim had been going through her watch prior to the incident. According to Hannah she told him to stop looking through her messages and that she wanted the watch back where he then attempted to grab her by the neck.
