
## Multiple Agencies Raid Compound on Beals Chapel; Six Charged with Felonies; Guns, Drugs and Stolen Property Discovered

Agent Brendan DeBoer, 9th DTF reported a major highlight and significant victory for law enforcement Monday, and to give credit where credit is due. Monday morning, a joint effort between the 9th Judicial Drug Task Force (JDTF), Loudon County, and Blount County SWAT teams successfully shut down a major drug operation at 14420 Beals Chapel Rd. in Lenoir City. For those of you who've been following along, this location has been a hub of criminal activity for several years, with frequent law enforcement calls, sustained drug use,

and its reputation as a haven for stolen property and wanted criminals

Agent Fritts and the 9th JDTF have been quietly monitoring the situation, gathering intelligence, and, through some serious legwork, managed to infiltrate the operation. With the help of a cooperator, multiple controlled buys were made from the suspects. By the time today rolled around. the residence, owned by Mike Brown, had become a squatters' paradise - housing numerous homeless individuals, drug users, and people with active warrants. We're talking about ten or more people occupying the house, barn, and various campers. Not exactly the type of neighborhood anvone dreams of living in.

In a well-coordinated effort, the SWAT teams from Loudon

and Blount County provided the necessary support to safely execute the search warrant. When law enforcement see Raid ctd. pg. 3

entered the property, they encountered 8 suspects and uncovered a staggering assortment of illegal items: over 100 grams of methamphetamine, 20 firearms, Fentanyl, cocaine, oxycodone, psychedelic mushrooms, marijuana, and various prescription pills. All in a day's work, right?

Thanks to the expertise and determination of Agent Fritts and the 9th JDTF, six individuals were arrested on felony drug charges, with additional charges related to firearms, especially considering the criminal backgrounds of several







Agent Fritts 9th DTF, along with other law enforcement personal executed a search warrant on a camper van at Beals Chapel Road.

Upon entry, David Queener and Jennifer Helton were found in the camper. The agent advised Helton of her Miranda rights, and she confirmed that she understood and agreed to speak with him. The agent asked Helton how much meth was in the camper, and she responded with a few ounces. The agent inquired if there was anything else illegal in the camper, and she stated that there was a pistol. The agent read Queener his Miranda rights, and he also stated that he understood and agreed to speak with him. The agent asked Queener if he had anything illegal in the camper, and he replied that there was a small amount of meth. The agent then asked if there were any firearms present in the camper, and he said he had a pistol under his pillow for protection. During the search of the camper, a Springfield 9mm was found under a pillow on the bed. Helton and Oueener are both convicted felons. In the oven, a black magnetic box containing 91.31 grams of methamphetamine and a bag of fentanyl weighing 0.87 grams was discovered.

Additionally, the camper contained 5.5 grams of marijuana, digital scales, cut straws, syringes, and baggies. Found in Queener's Tahoe was another bag of methamphetamine weighing 0.87 grams. Helton was found to have a VOP out of Loudon County. This incident occurred in Loudon County.

(B) Sixty (60) days from the date the creditor received an actual copy of the notice to creditors if the creditor received the copy of the notice less than sixty (60) days prior to the date that is four (4) months from the date of first publication (or posting) as described in (1) (A); or

(2) Twelve (12) months from the decedent's date of death.




